The level IV incident involved a patient scheduled for a podiatry procedure. The patient became apneic. The patient was intubated and ACLS measures provided. The patient was transferred to ICU.

### INPATIENT FALLS BY CATEGORY CY22:

Falls decreased by 5 falls from quarter 1 2022. There was (1) level III fall recorded for PCU. It was a witnessed fall. Pt fell on floor from bed. The patient sustained 2 abrasions to his bilateral shoulders and a skin tear to the right arm when he fell from his bed Safety sitter applied.

### HAPIS CY22:

HAPI's increased by 2 from Q1 2022. Patient found to have left upper buttock pressure. The HAPI was discovered as a stage 2. Patient is thin and frail. Centrella bed order and education provided. Patient re-evaluated and HAPI found to be a stage III. Patient remains in bed most of the time due to respiratory/secretion management. Education continues to be provided to staff and additional Centrella beds are also being ordered as part of the capital budget.

**SURGERY RELATED ISSUES CY22:**

Surgery related issues are up 12.5% more than Q1 2022. Surgical complication, Level IV - patient was seen in the OR for an elective gangrenous toe amputation procedure. The patient became unresponsive during anesthesia induction. Patient was mask ventilated and intubated. ACLS protocols started and patient developed Vfib and returned to normal sinus rhythm. Patient was transferred to ICU for further care.

Patient leaned over and cut his forehead with the cuffs. Handcuffs were repositioned behind his back by police officer. The patient was medicated and remained under close observation.
