Congratulations to the 58 Plainswomen and Plainsmen student-athletes named NJCAA Academic All-Americans in the 2021-2022 school year! There were 24-first team, 15-second team and 19-third team selections who dotted the classrooms at Northeastern Junior College this past school year. We could not be more proud!

Northeastern Junior College released its Honor Roll list for the spring 2022 semester and reports that 342 students were given high academic achievement recognition, including 172 students who made the president's list by earning a 4.0 grade point average.

In May, a few former NJC students traveled to Germany, Austria, and Switzerland on an NJC-sponsored trip. They took some amazing photos from their trip! EF Educational Tours organized all arrangements and itinerary.

The Northeastern Junior College Foundation is pleased to announce the Rex and Doris Monahan Memorial Scholarship. This scholarship aims to support Northeastern students enrolled in the new T-Prep Program. The T-Prep Program, which is a partnership with CU Denver's School of Education and Human Development, allows students to take classes at Northeastern to earn an associate's degree in education. Students are able to complete their following two years at Northeastern to earn their bachelor's degree from CU Denver without having to leave the area. The T-Prep program is available at Northeastern for the following licensure options: Early Childhood Education, Elementary Education, and Special Education. A scholarship to support these students has been established by Rex William (Bill) Monahan in memory of his parents, Rex and Doris Monahan, who were residents of Sterling and active community and NJC supporters for more than fifty years.

Northeastern Junior College has expanded services to provide students with additional opportunities to see a medical professional or a counselor.

Through our partnership with AcademicLiveCare (ALC), students now have access to an extensive online program featuring 24/7 on-demand counseling, urgent medical care, therapy and psychiatry all at no cost to the student.
