• INNOVATIVE EDUCATION – ALLEVATO FEATURED BY CBS4

• ACC, LOCKHEED MARTIN DEVELOPING TECH WORKFORCE

Seven ACC students and graduates have launched their careers with positions at Lockheed Martin through the Software Associate Degree Program (SWAP) and Community College Pathways to Space (CCPS) programs. Lockheed Martin recruits students in pursuit of technical 2-year degrees to attract, develop and retain early-career technical professionals who seek employment in software and cyber-related fields. ACC/ARAPAHOE COUNTY RECEIVE \$739K FROM COSI

The Colorado Opportunity Scholarship Initiative (COSI) board approved 66 proposals in May 2022 to provide \$4.97 million in scholarships for underresourced Colorado students. COSI's Matching Student Scholarship Program leverages community scholarship dollars with a one-to-one match. ACC, on behalf of Arapahoe County, will receive an allocation of \$739,420 from this round of COSI.

• INNOVATION – CHCC FEATURED BY THE DENVER POST & 9NEWS

ACC's <u>Colorado Health Careers Collaborative (CHCC)</u> was featured by *The Denver Post / YourHub* on Aug. 4, as well as by *9NEWS* on Aug. 12. More than 150 students successfully completed the inaugural CHCC Academy during the summer of 2022. The CHCC was created to provide seamless pathways from school to employment in healthcare fields for high school and college-age students in Colorado. The CHCC Academy, which is free for eligible participants, is comprised of six weeks of instruction and mentoring delivered in a self-paced virtual format from Monday – Thursday, as well as 5-6 hours of on-site training/instruction each Friday. Graduates of the summer 2022 CHCC Academy represented multiple Denver-area school districts, as well as five communitybased organizations. In the fall of 2021, ACC and the Community College of Denver were awarded \$2 million through ZOMALAB's SyncUp Colorado Workforce Design Challenge to develop and implement the CHCC. <u>Denver Post</u> <u>story</u> / <u>9NEWS story</u>

• \$3.5M ARPA SUBRECIPIENT GRANT FROM ARAPAHOE COUNTY

ACC has received an American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) Subrecipient Grant from Arapahoe County in the amount of \$3.5 million for renovations and the construction of ACC's new Health Innovation Center at the Littleton Campus. The Subrecipient Grant is made possible through an agreement between ACC, the Arapahoe County Board of Commissioners, the State of Colorado, the Colorado Department of Higher Education, and the State Board for Community Colleges and Occupational Education. A disbursement of Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds (SLFRF) was provided to Arapahoe County by the U.S. Department of the Treasury to support pandemic recovery efforts by rebuilding a stronger, more equitable economy. Arapahoe County selected ACC and the Health Innovation Center project as a subrecipient of SLFRF.
