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2. Indigenous Student Recruitment Project

- **a.** CNCC has been identified by the Lumina Foundation as the featured rural college for the "REACH Deeper Initiative".
- **b.** CNCC has received \$25,000 to work directly with an identified consultant to help recruit and retain Indigenous/Native American students.
- **c.** CNCC has double the number of Indigenous students enrolled in the last 3 years. The number is still very small but moving in the right direction.

A. Audits

- CCCS FY23 Financial Audit- There are no CNCC Findings. The audit can be found at https://leg.colorado.gov/sites/default/files/documents/audit/colorado community college system 6.30.2023.pdf
- Perkins Fund Audit- The CCCS Internal Audit Team were very complimentary regarding the
 outcome of the CNCC audit. There was an item discovered from 35 years ago in terms of
 inventory/assets but beyond that, no material findings. CNCC team members were also
 applauded for being good to work with.

B. CNCC Grants and Capital Projects

• Capital Renewal Project: The \$3.7 million project requested will upgrade/replace insulation, siding, and windows in 10 of CNCC Rangely's buildings. The first draft of the Governor's budget recommended funding for the CNCC project.

Dr. Jones, Lindsey Blake and James Caldwell testified before the Capital Development Committee on December 14, 2023. The feedback seemed positive with next steps including inclusion (if approved) of this project in the long bill in May.

- CR IT Updates- This project is now complete. It was funded from the CNCC IT
 Upgrade project, The Rural College Consortium, and 103K from MCAJCD. Nearly
 every classroom has received improved internet access, to the desktop, upgraded
 computers and improved AV equipment. Most classrooms have the ability for
 synchronous instructions between our classrooms and HS district classrooms.
- Cabinet approved team members to submit the following non state/federal grant applications- 1. Rural Cyber Clinics grant 2. Veteran's Assistance Grant and 3. Identity Based Violence Prevention Grant
