She has also been invited to present her research at the BEA convention in Las Vegas in April 2024.

MCC Spanish Faculty, Monica Carrasco, is offering a 15-week non-credit course on Conversational Spanish for Town of Bennett employees. There was such a high demand for the course that it filled at 20 participants and a second course will be held in the future for additional Town staff.



MCC received a donation of \$1,000,000 to establish the Gene Doty Health Scholarships and Programs Endowment. The endowment will substantially impact health education at MCC by helping fund scholarships, equipment, instructional staff, and educational materials.

MCC received a \$25K grant from the Lumina Foundation to support Weekend College efforts. A portion of the money is designated to give students a \$100 stipend to use as needed if they attend at least 50% of a course. The grant also funds a marketing postcard for the program. Leftover funding will be used to stock the student food pantry.

MCC held a groundbreaking ceremony for the Dahms-Talton Center for Skilled Trades and Technology on December 14. The new building will provide needed space for MCC trades programs, including Electromechanical Technology (ELMT) and Industrial Controls and Telematics (ICT). The ceremony was followed with a reception.



MCC updated Extron equipment in the Fort Morgan campus classrooms with the help of grant funding. The equipment serves as the interface between computers and projectors and is a critical part of classroom technology. Two main meeting rooms have also been upgraded with additional microphones to better enable virtual meetings.

MCC acquired property located at 300 Dexter Street in Wray, Colorado on December 19. This future site of a new MCC Wray Center marks a significant step in the college's commitment to meeting the evolving needs of its students and the Wray community. MCC plans to host community conversations in the spring to further determine the needs for educational programs and opportunities in the region.
