Transform the student experience.



Trinidad State Robotics Team members gave community presentations at a recent Community Opportunity Fair. Each student shared their expertise and explained the progression of robots built at Trinidad State and the challenges they encountered. This year's robotics team is building one small robot and one large robot (plus understudies). The team is building the small robot small enough to be below the 1.5 kg weight limit while still being able to run upside down. The first goal for each robot is to navigate the sand dunes.

The bigger robot will run in the upper weight category and will need to have the capability to communicate with the small robot. The team has decided to further the mapping work of the 2022 Team. That team succeeded in making a map of the course, but not in communicating the hazards to another robot. So, this year's team plans to have the small robot go through the course to determine the best course, then send that map back to the big robot. The big robot will follow that map, go through the course, stop, take a soil sample, and then bring that sample back to the start.

Two Balloon Sat teams are setting goals, deciding what they will fly inside their payload and will begin construction soon. We will update you on progress after the competitions in April.



Trinidad State College added **Women's Wrestling** to its list of offered NJCAA sports in 2023-24. In January, the Trojan women hosted Wayland Baptist University for the *first ever* home women's wrestling match in TSC history. The Trojans fell to the four-year school but put on a great showing picking up a few pinfall victories. TSC is ranked 10th in the NJCAA with wrestlers Nadiya Trujillo (4th) and Giana Roskam (7th) ranked individually. They will compete at the NJCAA National Tournament in early March.
