- 3. General. VMI's "Call to Duty" program supplementing ROTC scholarships to pay for room & board continues to have a positive effect in retaining in-bound scholarship winners. Tuition and fees will increase 2.9% in 2025. Athletics funding faces a shortfall of\$ M. Tuition and fees contribute 39% ofVMI's budget; Alumni Agencies contribute 27%.
- 4. Army ROTC. (Slide 2 Army ROTC SY 2023-2024)
 - a. Enrollment: Currently 1,150 enrolled with 348 (30%) contracted.
 - b. Spring 2024 Training Outlook.
 - I) SPRING FTX (05-09 APRIL 2024) at Goshen Boy Scout Res.; MSIV provide command & control; MS III Squad Training Exercise (STX) Lanes in prep for Cadet Summer Training (CST); MS I/ II Individual and Squad level tasks.
 - 2) Three (3) Control Times (24 Feb/17 Mar/29 Apr)
 - 3) Ranges (17 March; FORT BARFOOT)
 - c. Ranger Challenge Competition Dates Sandhurst at USMA 22-28 April. Ranger team won regional Ranger Challenge earlier to qualify for Sandhurst for second year in a row. VMI team placed 16th overall out of 48 teams. Additionally, a team of eight cadets

- d. Summer 2024 Highlights:
- 1) Projected to Commission 106 Second Lieutenants in MAY 24 (80 AD, 13 USAR, 13 NG)
- 2) Projected to Commission three Second Lieutenants in Dec 24
- 3) AROTC Cadre support Cadet Summer Training 2024 at FT Knox, KY; Basic Camp and Advanced Camp
- 4) 130 MSIII / MS IV contracted Cadets to attend Advanced Camp
- 5) 14 Cadre members to support CST (Cadet Summer Training) '24
- 6) Project 17 Cadets to complete CAIT (Cadet Advanced Individual Training) Schools m Summer '24
- 7) Project 26 Cadets to complete CTLT (Cadet Troop Leader Training), 12 Internship Programs
- e. Issues/Concerns. Large Cadre Turnover (eight personnel) in next 3-4 months, to include PMS/XO/ SGM. COL Hanson, FA to become PMS, MAJ(P) Stone to become XO, and MSG Plank projected to become SGM.

5. Naval ROTC. (Slide 3 - NROTC SY 2023-2024)

- a. Enrollment: Currently 262 midshipmen enrolled. Change of option from Navy to Marine curtailed beginning Spring 2024 due to Navy personnel requirements.
- b. NROTC ranking compared with other NROTC units is outstanding-see slide.
- c. Spring Training Synopsis.
- 1) Navy: 83 at Smith Mountain Lake for small boat piloting, firefighting, and recovering disabled boats. 20 at Naval Station Norfolk to tour LPD, LHD, DDG, CG, SSN, & CVN.
- 2) Marines: (140) at Col Sadler (VMI '66) Farm for Day/Night Land Navigation and small Unit Leadership Evaluations.
- d. Spring 2024 Highlights.
- 1) Navy SWO (17) Ship Selection Feb 28-29
- 2) Nuke Power Program 15 selected (VMI quota was 11) 12 x Submarine; 3 x Surface NUPOC; and 8 MIDN passed interviews with 7 scheduled for 16 & 18APR
- 3) 14 rising 1/C MIDN to 1/C Cruise
- 4) 31 rising 1/C MIDN to OCS (25 NROTC scholarships; 6 PLC/OCC
- 5) Sideload Scholarships: ~20 USN applications submitted for Summer Board; 18 of 18 USMC submissions approved by Spring Board (IO x 4/C, 5 x 3/C, and 2 x 2/C
- e. Issues & Challenges.
- I) Route 11 Bike lane/KH parking
- 2) Personnel Turnover this Summer: Military: I x Col, I x Maj (USMC) (Out of 4 Marines). 2 x LTs (USN) (Out of 7 Sailors). Civilian: I x Exec Asst (Retiring). 2 x Human Resources Asst (Retiring)
- 3) Staff manning being reduced 55%.

6. Air Force ROTC. (Slide 4 - AFROTC AY 2023-2024)

- a. Enrollment: Currently 133 enrolled. Detachment is seventh largest in AFROTC. No cadets pursuing commission in USSF.

- 4) Detachment Cadre turnover (27% 3 people); First USSF Capt coming to Detachment Staff
- 5) VMI Days during Spring FTX; other Dets/Universities invited to partner with us and VMI for LRC exposure
- 6) AFSPECWAR Southeast Hub Training: 72 cadets from IO schools to participate
- d. Issues/Concerns.
- I) Continuation of "Call to Duty" Scholarships
- 2) Delay in AFROTC AFSC, Base of Preference, Rated Board Results to align with USAFA
- 3) AF Delay in reviewing Medical waivers for AS200s to compete for POC Selection Process (PSP)
- 4) Lack of funding for AFROTC Scholarships; potentially zero In-College Scholarship Funding
- 5) All Cadets must be contracted and obtain CAC Cards prior to attending Field Training (logistical challenge)

COL Bogart updated the committee on the following subjects/issues.
