Advancing Equity in Higher Education: CCD President Joins Panel at Colorado HSI Consortium

On September 20, Community College of Denver President, Dr. Marielena DeSanctis, took part in a pivotal panel discussion at the Colorado Hispanic-Serving Institutions (HSI) Consortium event hosted on the Auraria Campus. The panel brought together leaders from Colorado's Hispanic-Serving Institutions to discuss the critical role of HSIs in advancing equity, access, and student success for Latinx students.

During the discussion, Dr. DeSanctis highlighted CCD's commitment to fostering an inclusive environment and removing barriers for underrepresented students, sharing insights from the college's participation in the Moon Shot for Equity initiative. She emphasized that institutions like CCD play a vital role in bridging educational gaps by providing targeted support services, career-connected learning opportunities, and workforce responsive curriculum.

Dr. DeSanctis also stressed the importance of collaboration among Colorado's HSIs to create statewide pathways for success, not just for Latinx students, but for



all students from historically marginalized communities. Her remarks underscored CCD's leadership in addressing systemic inequities and its dedication to success beyond graduation.

The panel reflected a shared vision among leaders to elevate Colorado's higher education system as a national model for serving diverse student populations, particularly as HSIs continue to grow in importance across the state.



This year, a group of CCD's chemistry students achieved national recognition by presenting their research at the prestigious American Chemical Society (ACS) conference. Under the guidance of Chemistry Assistant Professor Tina Zhao and faculty member Joel Thompson, the students collaborated with Denver Water to monitor local streams and assess water quality, a project that highlights the importance of environmental stewardship.

The students' research, focused on identifying potential contaminants and evaluating the health of the local ecosystem, provided them with valuable hands-on experience in environmental chemistry. Encouraging Student Involvement at CCD's "Find Your Flock" Event






Auraria Campus: A \$2.7 Billion Engine of Economic Growth

The recently published Auraria Economic Impact Report highlights the substantial contributions of the Auraria Campus to Colorado's economy, with a combined economic impact of \$2.7 billion and the support of 19,723 jobs statewide in 2023. The findings were made public in a press release from the Auraria Higher Education Center (AHEC), underscoring the collaborative power of CCD, MSU Denver, and CU Denver.

Conducted by Parker Strategy Group, the report illustrates how the Auraria Campus serves not only as a hub of education but as a significant driver of economic growth across the state. CCD's Institutional Research and Finance teams were instrumental in contributing data for this report, providing critical insights gathered early last Spring to offer a comprehensive view of the college's economic role.

"The impact we make as part of the Auraria Campus community is clear," said Dr. Marielena DeSanctis, President of CCD. "We're not just preparing students for the workforce, we're actively shaping Colorado's economy through our agile and innovative programming to substantively close the talent gap for employers and maximize future earnings for our graduates."

The report underscores the importance of CCD's career-driven programs, which equip students with in-demand skills in fields such as healthcare, technology, and business. These programs have helped position CCD as a vital resource for both students and employers, contributing to the economic



stability of the region.

The shared-service model that underpins the Auraria Campus allows for operational efficiencies, reducing costs while enhancing collective outcomes for the three institutions. This unique approach magnifies the impact of each individual college, delivering tangible benefits to the state of Colorado.
