1. President's Updates



Colorado Business Round Table Meeting:

RRCC hosted the Colorado Business Round Table meeting at the Arvada campus. COBRT Partners participated in a roundtable discussion with U.S. Rep Brittany Pettersen at Red Rocks Community College. The discussion centered on critical issues for a strong business climate, including Workforce Development, Tax Reform, and Immigration Reform.


3. Campus Developments
