- Red Rocks Community College Secures Federal Funding To Close Equity Gaps In Stem
- Red Rocks Community College (RRCC) secured \$300,000 in federal funding for a workforce development program that aims to diversify science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM) fields. Led by Congressman Ed Perlmutter, the investment is part of a \$7.6 million package benefitting Jefferson and Arapahoe Counties that recently passed the U.S. House of Representatives.
- The funds will go towards RRCC's Reach, Reason, Connect and Create initiative that aims to recruit and retain more Coloradans of color in high tech industries, especially Latinx and Hispanic students who make up a growing share of the college's service area. With campuses in Lakewood and Arvada, RRCC partners with several top companies in aerospace, energy, cybersecurity, and other advanced fields that have significant demand for skilled workers
- "We are grateful to Congressman Perlmutter for supporting this innovative program," said Dr. Michele Haney, president of RRCC. "With this funding, RRCC can positively increase the number of Coloradans of color who obtain a college degree and ultimately start their career in one of the many high-tech industries in our service area."

CCCS Wins State Grant To Expand Open Educational Resources

 The Colorado Community College System (CCCS) won a \$130,907 grant from the Colorado Department of Higher Education (CDHE) to design business management courses using open educational resources (OER), free or low-cost textbooks and course materials that have saved CCCS students more than \$13 million since 2018. In addition to the CCCS system office's award, RRCC was one of several CCCS colleges that won a CDHE grant to fund OER-related projects. Red Rocks Community College, \$42,879

EDU Feature Article: A Look at VAMA Department Chair, Paul Weinrauch, The Visual Arts, Media Arts Program at Colorado's Red Rocks Community College. The Visual Arts, Media Arts Program at Colorado's Red Rocks Community College shifts to stay relevant -- Here's how it happened: More than two decades ago, Paul Weinrauch sold all his material goods, packed his bags, and traveled the US with his camera, capturing the beauty of America along the way. That marked his full-fledged entry into photography, which eventually led to a career in wedding and architectural photography, then advertising and corporate work. But Paul always knew he wanted to move into teaching, and he first dipped his feet in those educational waters as an adjunct instructor at Red Rocks Community College in Lakewood, Colorado. "Then, almost three years ago, I decided to make the leap and go full time" at Red Rocks, where he now heads up the Visual Arts Media Department, overseeing students who study videography and film, journalism, graphic design, UI UX, and simulation and game design, photography, among other subjects.

- One of my biggest goals when I took over the department was to create the
 equipment "cage." When students first get here, they don't have the gear
 they need or even know what they need to buy. We decided to build this unit
 that would house all kinds of equipment—from cameras and lenses to
 lighting and grip gear so that students could start their program without
 having to drop thousands of dollars right off the bat.
- When they do decide to put money down on equipment, it's based from their experience using what we have in-house already. I've also concentrated a lot on rebuilding programs at Red Rocks. For instance, I rewrote the entire professional photography degree to make sure we were offering courses that were relevant. Students could walk away after graduating and be able to immediately jump into a career or contract or start their own business.
- There was also no portfolio class when I arrived, so one of the first things I did when I got here was start to set that up. Things can move slowly in academia, so this semester is the first time we have been able to offer it. It focuses on such things as creating your own website, setting up a profile on LinkedIn, printed portfolio, and other avenues to promote yourself and your work. Another priority is to reach out to professionals in the community and involve students in outside work. Work-based learning is important. We have an industry experience class where the students get to do real work with real clients. I'm still a working professional in the field myself, and in the past two months, I've hired two students to come on jobs with me.
