## CCA Raises Record-breaking Funds at Annual Scholarship Luncheon

The Community College of Aurora's Annual Scholarship Luncheon, hosted by the CCA Foundation on April 7, raised almost \$200,000. This amount raised was a 46% increase over the previous year as well as a record for this fund-raising event. Added to previous contributions and existing scholarships, the CCA Foundation will be able to award \$600,000 to students this year. Part of the luncheon included a presentation by Ashley Smialek, nursing faculty, on the use of an automatic external defibrillator (AED). John Wolfkill, CCA Foundation Executive Director, noted "the incredible generosity of the 400 community and industry leaders that attended."
