<u>2023 – 2024 Iowa Central Athletics</u>

On behalf of Iowa Central Athletics, we thank our administration and board of trustees for allowing us the opportunity to offer the most comprehensive community college athletic program in the country! We had 1,050 student-athletes in our 33 athletic programs in the 2023-24 academic year. Your foresight and vision helped pave the way for success in the classroom, on the fields, and on the courts for our participants. Moving into the 2024-25 academic year we will continue to push forward and do everything in our power to ensure our student-athletes have a positive experience at Iowa Central. We strive to ensure each participant thrives in and outside of the classroom and on and off the field.

Program and Facility Enhancements

- Thirteen of our teams achieved national top -10 rankings.
- Most decorated academic group of student-athletes in school history:
 - \circ First semester: 465 student-athletes received academic-all region awards (268 1st team & 197-2nd team).
 - \circ Second semester: 495 student-athletes received academic-all region awards (307 1st team & 188 2nd team).
 - o Overall: 960 student-athletes received academic all-region status.
- Unveiling of our new turf practice facility-equipped with MUSCO Lighting (first practice took place on September 12, 2023) a "difference maker" for our entire athletic program.
- Clubhouse opened for our baseball program at the turf complex out at Harlan Rogers a true game changer for our program.
- Completion of the turf softball field at Harlan Rogers which will be home to our Triton softball program this fall for practice and for our spring season state of the art facility.
- Our men's doubles team claimed the first-ever national championship in tennis.
- Compensation packages were evaluated for coaching staff based on the classification and compensation study completed by the college. On behalf of the entire Iowa Central Athletic Department, we would like to thank the Board of Trustees and the college administration for investing in our staff. This has not only been a 'game changer' for our athletic department but 'life-changing' for many. The enhanced salary structure makes it easier to retain top-level head and assistant coaches, and it allows us to recruit high-caliber replacements when necessary. Our athletic department is deeply appreciative and does not take this support for granted. We are truly grateful!
