Congratulations to **Torie Sandoval** who was named to the NJCAA All-American team. Torie was selected to the All-American Third Team and is the third Lady Trojan to become an NJCAA All-American. Sandoval broke every TSC pitching record during her career. She now has the most career wins (49), most career strikeouts (381), lowest ERA (2.46), most innings pitched (353), most wins in a single season (27) and most strikeouts in a season with 196 K's. Her 27 wins this season ranked her 5th in the nation and she was 13th in the nation with 196 K's. We are enormously proud of you Torie.



For some gunsmiths, the dream of earning an Associate of Applied Science, Gunsmithing degree by attending school for two years is not possible. Trinidad State offers an opportunity for students to attend short-term classes in the summer, which will earn them credit toward a **Gunsmithing Technician certificate**. The 16-credit hour certificate includes skills building such as basic and advanced machine shop, welding for gunsmiths, bluing, and benchmetal hand tools and metallurgy. Oftentimes, students attend summer classes multiple years before earning a certificate. This year, five students completed the Gunsmithing Technician certificate.
