#### Early Childhood 0-5 Work

- A Strategic Plan has been developed with the following goals
  - Promote and connect families to ECEC programs and services.
  - Increase collaboration amongst providers to ensure seamless delivery system, appropriate placement and access to services, and reduction of redundancies in services.
  - Grow ECEC workforce in Region 47 to address identified barriers to enrollment due to lack of qualified workforce.
  - Increase the number of available 0-3 & 3 5 slots
  - Improved school readiness and success.
  - Increase the programs and services provided to children and families by the ROE
- The team is working to apply to offer Gateways credit for Early Childhood
- Available to help with grant writing, setting up new classrooms, monitoring, and in any other area needed.
- Representative are serving on the Birth to Five Illinois Action Council
- Family focus groups and community play dates scheduled for spring (see below)
- Community baby showers with a parent education component will be offered starting this summer
- Onesies and coordinated intake information will be provided to area hospitals to send home with new parents

Sauk Valley Media- "Merdian and Elmendorf joined the Amboy administrators in the afternoon to share the news about the ISBE recognition. Merdian said it is a genuine validation of a program that keeps busy. While driving over to Amboy, she fielded additional referrals. "The whole school year, so far, we're at 3,650 contacts," she said. "So we're very, very busy. There's only three of us." She said the addition of Sterling Public Schools, which is Whiteside County's largest school district, to the program this semester may require additional hiring.

But it is programs like Amboy, a rural school district with 721 students, which can be helped by Nexus and similar efforts. The student body is 43.6% low income and 12% on individual education programs. The district's mobility rate – moving in and out of the district – is at 9.4%, which is above the state average."

# Parents as Teachers First Years

We completed our program monitoring in February with the Illinois State Board of Education. As part of that process, they asked us to identify the towns that each of our children live in. Here's the list for this year so far:


That's 80 infants and toddlers!

30% of our children are also dealing with a significant transition in their young lives:

- 8 children are homeless
- 12 children involved with Intact Family Services (open DCFS case)
- 5 children are in foster care.

# **Education Outreach Program**

We are in the process of applying to NCI Works/BEST, Inc. for a grant to continue our program for next year. We have been a grant recipient since 2003 and during that time over 770 students have received GED instruction, employment services, and many other supportive services through the Education Outreach Program.

The Education Outreach Program is continuing to enroll new students and we have seen an increase in applications this past month.

# **Regional Center for Change**

Teamwork makes the dream work here at C4C! We are happy to inform you that our student, Madison Nolen, is one of the five finalists for the Outstanding Student Award at the ICEARY conference! ICEARY had great nominations, making it a very difficult decision for our judges and scoring. Madison came out as one of the top 5! In Madison's essay for the Outstanding Student Award she states, "with all that on my plate and the feeling of giving up, I still go to school and get what I need done. Center For Change has given me a second chance to finish high school. It has given me so many opportunities. There is a saying at my school, "We are the Center For Change, not the Center For Staying The Same." As corny as that may sound it carries a lot of meaning. I'm not the same person I was before I came to Center For Change. Before C4C, I

would say, "I'm not going to college or even make it past high school," but once I got to Center For Change, that changed".



We are excited to announce that our very own Principal Mark Morris won the Excellence in Education Award at the ICEARY conference on March 2nd! Mark was one of only 4 Winners of the award from around the entire state! Mark has created an environment that allows students to transform and succeed to go on and do amazing things. Mark doesn't hide from the dark and scary things that happen in this world. He has experienced many things in his young life that some much older than him haven't had to encounter. He isn't afraid, to be honest, and vulnerable with his students. The students see that vulnerability isn't a sign of weakness or defeat but of personal growth.



#### Truant Alternative Program

Our busiest time of the year is upon us. We currently have 500 students that we are actively working with or attempting to provide services to. February and March are when we receive the most truancy referrals as students are meeting the schools attendance policy and have exceeded their allowed 'call off' limit. We anticipate having approximately 550 total referrals for this school year. In addition to monitoring daily attendance, connecting with families, and providing linkage to community referrals, our team is always seeking out networking opportunities. Two of our team members participated in a McKinney Vento Homeless Simulation in the month of February which provided an excellent opportunity for school staff to experience living a "month" in the shoes of our families in transition. Our at-risk team will also be attending ICEARY in March and we are looking forward to this conference's variety of learning experiences. We welcomed our newest team member, Emily Heitman, and she has started off the second semester like a champion!

#### McKinney Vento Homeless Program

The ICEARY Conference in Bloomington is a Statewide Conference that highlights the McKinney-Vento program and resources available and needs that each area is facing. It is held annually and always is a great opportunity to share and enlighten our knowledge of the program. There has also been the completion of the Poverty Simulation Exercise. It is a wonderful means of exposing people to the difficulties and challenges that our families face on a day to day basis. It is always very well received by the audience.
