Letter of Notification Between Michael J. Smith Airport And 97th Civil Affairs Battalion (Special Operations) (Airborne)

Dear Sir/Ma'am,

The 97th Civil Affairs Battalion (Special Operations) (Airborne) request support from Michael J. Smith Airport for our units' annual Realistic Military Training to be conducted tentatively from 12 September 2022 to 16 September 2022. The unit requires a realistic urban and rural training environment where we can practice tactics, techniques, and procedures that our Soldiers will employ during overseas missions in support of Special Operations Command. Participation from your facilities will allow the 97th Civil Affairs Battalion (Special Operations) (Airborne) the opportunity to execute real world training in critical focus areas that include collaboration between local officials and law enforcement, information sharing, network building, local organizations, and relationship building with community leaders.

Specifically, we hope you will support our training by allowing our Soldiers to visit your facilities. The Soldiers of the 97th Civil Affairs Battalion (Special Operations) (Airborne) would like to meet with staff members of your facilities for the purpose of conducting assessments related to disaster preparedness and risk reduction. Meetings with facility managers, local officials and local law enforcement will be conducted during business hours, and every attempt will be made to minimize any disruption to normal facility operations.

Within the Michael J. Smith Airport, the 97th Civil Affairs Battalion (Special Operations) (Airborne) will:

- a. Provide an operations brief to facility managers prior to the execution of the training exercise.
- b. If requested, provide daily updates to facility managers regarding the exercise's training progress.
- c. Conduct interviews with local officials, but will not publish their names. Interviewees may decline to answer any/all questions, whether of a personal or professional nature. Any information provided shall be on a voluntary basis and will be used for exercise purposes only. At the conclusion of the exercise, any associated information/documentation will be appropriately discarded.

- d. Not gather or electronically store any Personally Identifiable Information on any local official or member of the public. Only aliases of individuals voluntarily participating in the exercise shall be used.
- e. Contact the facility manager or his/her delegated representative and provide results of the training exercise based on assessments conducted by the 97th Civil Affairs Battalion (Special Operations) (Airborne).
- f. Not carry firearms of any kind (government-issued or privately owned).
- g. Dress in casual or business casual civilian attire throughout the duration of the training. At no time, will Soldiers conduct themselves outside of their capacity as an exercise participant and service member in the United States Army. Soldiers will not wear uniforms, carry weapons, or utilize tactical vehicles throughout the duration of the training.
- h. Adhere to all local, state, and federal laws.
- Use Geographical Information Systems to conduct topographical and hazardsbased analysis of the facility.
- j. Not conduct any offensive or defensive combat training scenarios within facility limits.
- k. Immediately inform local authorities of any incident involving any member of the 97th Civil Affairs Battalion (Special Operations) (Airborne).
