Police

The State of Alaska is still maintaining an advisory for the Covid-19 regulations, for all state residents to continue social distancing and the use of masks when in door public places.

St. Paul Dept. of Public Safety is currently reviewing obtaining a CLIA licenses and insurance to preform Rapid testing / antigen tests for Covid-19. Currently SC clinic is not preforming rapid test after hours and on weekends.

St. Paul Dept. of Public Safety is continues assisting the St. Paul Community & St. Paul Unified Command in providing updated educational material to those traveling to St. Paul from outside the community. The 14-day quarantine is still mandatory for all traveling to St. Paul.

St. Paul Dept. of Public Safety has responded to 15 Covid19 related calls for service since late January 1st, 2021.

St. Paul Dept. of Public Safety has been directing more calls of service to be addressed by the Aleut Tribal Court towards civil infractions and community COVID-19 violations.

St. Paul Dept. of Public Safety has received and or responded to 340 calls for service.

Dispatch

St. Paul Dispatch has received a new radio allowing for improved communication with taxing ships entering and leaving the St. Paul harbor.

EMS / Ambulance

St. Paul Dept. of Public Safety has had a total of 49 medicals for 2021.

St. Paul Dept. of Public Safety City management has temporarily suspended the ETT and EMT full course for certification. State of Alaska has advised ETT recerts completions have been extended until June 2021.

St. Paul Public Safety Officers will be scheduling and completing their ETT re-certification in the future. Those needing the ETT full course training opportunities and arrangements will be reviewed with current St. Paul emergency ordinances and Covid19 restrictions applied.

St. Paul First responders are fully equipped with PPE to help protect against the airborne virus COVID-19.



Fire Department / SAR

St. Paul Volunteer Fire Dept. personal along with Search and Rescue, EMS, SPDPS had all portable & emergency radio's programmed and they have since been assigned out to personnel.

Fire/SAR along with EMS have monthly trainings to stay fluid on emergency equipment as well as new equipment that has been received.

Harbor Master

The St. Paul Harbor has been very busy through the 2021 Crab season thus far. The Harbor Officer has stated over 450 boats have come into the Harbor since January, though some are duplicated boats.

Harbor has ordered new life rings and cabinets set to replace the outdated life rings. Once these arrive, they will be installed.
