#### • Pikes Peak State College to launch vocational scholarship program

Students interested in vocational skills could be eligible for thousands of dollars in new scholarships at PPSC. PPSC announced on Friday it was launching a vocational scholarship program after an anonymous donor gave more than \$843,750 to establish the Spark Fund.

Each student is eligible for up to \$2,500 per year for two years as long as they meet the scholarship's criteria. Qualified students reside in El Paso County, are high school graduates or equivalent, maintain a 2.0 GPA, enroll in a minimum of six credit hours per semester and are committed to completing a degree or certificate. Spark Fund scholarship recipients can use this money on tuition assistance, books or supplies.

• <u>Pikes Peak State College, Peak Education launch 2-year program to</u> support Hispanic, Latino students

PPSC is increasing its concurrent enrollment opportunities and support services for Colorado Springs' Hispanic and Latino high school students through a two-year pilot program, the college announced in a news release Tuesday. The program is a joint effort alongside Peak Education, an organization supporting low-income students with the college admission process. PPSC will hire a full-time concurrent enrollment navigator, who will train with Peak Education and

## • <u>District 11 expands promise scholarship to give students free ride to college</u>

The D11 Promise Scholarship Program guarantees free tuition and requires books to attend Pikes Peak State college for a period of up to three years or 60 credit hours. The program started last year as the Mitchell Promise program and was only offered to qualifying seniors and Mitchell High School.

The program is made possible by funding from organizations including the Bruni Foundation, Dakota Foundation, and Legacy Institute to offer scholarships to any eligible D11 senior.

To be eligible students must graduate from a D11 high school or D11 charter school with a 2.5 or better GPA, complete a FASFA and/or Colorado Application for State Financial Aid (CASFA) application, achieve at least 90% attendance records during high school, and enroll at Pikes Peak State College within 18 months of graduation.

The district said it and Pikes Peak State College are seeking permanent funding for the program during the initial period of the D11 Promise Program.

#### • <u>Pikes Peak State College, Colorado State University Pueblo partner to</u> <u>ease transfer process</u>

PPSC held a Ribbon Cutting ceremony at PPSC Centennial Campus on September 25 to celebrate a joint partnership between the college and CSU Pueblo. CSU Pueblo created a transfer center on PPSC's Centennial campus as part of its five-year agreement to ease students' transfer process. Students can now stay at

the PPSC Centennial campus to obtain both an associate and a bachelor's degree from the two institutions.

#### <u>Pikes Peak State College Eyes Hispanic-Serving Institution Designation</u>

CCCS news highlights PPSC efforts on building relationships, fostering community, and keeping up momentum. Janae Knipp, PPSC College Bilingual Recruitment and Admissions Specialist claims, "We are on the right track, and we need to keep the momentum."

After years of planning, the college is eyeing a Hispanic-Serving Institution (HSI) designation from the U.S. Department of Education. The status would make PPSC eligible for additional federal funding and resources to support its Hispanic and Latiné students, who currently make up about 23% of PPSC's student body. To apply, that percentage must tick up two points to 25%.

But the college has set a broader goal than reaching a specific threshold, says Roberto Garcia, PPSC vice president of student services. Becoming an HSI means giving back to families who have shaped the history, culture, and economic strength of the region.

"Our Latiné community has been an engine for prosperity and progress in our region, and they have high expectations for themselves for their children," said Garcia. "We're positioned for and committed to advancing the educational and career interests of the community."
