NJC supported Kids College 2023 throughout the summer. Classes offered for local kids included Diamond Painting; Emotions in Motion; Pokémon Club; Rockets; Amazing Tales, D&D for Kids; Augmented Architecture; Tie Dye Basics; The World of Philosophy According to Children's Books; Intro to Dungeons & Dragons; Gone Fishing; Piano Camp for Beginners; Presto, the Art of Magic; Crime Scene Investigation; Intro to Magic the Gathering; Harry Potter Philosophy; and Graphic Novel Creation Club.

Starting in June, Northeastern launched its new accelerated business program in Yuma, catering to working adults. We very much appreciate Dr. Ryan Ross speaking to our students to kick off our 2023 Fall Semester! His inspiring words prepare our freshmen for a great year!




Returning students enjoyed a club fair where campus clubs, activities and members of the community came to welcome the students, offer discounts at local venues, and solicit interest in campus activities.

NJC held orientation for new faculty members on August 1-14. Faculty and staff were welcomed back with In-Service days on August 15-16. The In-Service activities started with a welcome from President Mike White. Workshops were held on CCSSEE (Community College Survey of Student Engagement), Navigate, OER (Open Educational Resources), Assessment and D2L Training.

NJC held an Introduction to Beekeeping course on Saturday, August 26. The course included classroom and hands-on in the field apiary experience. Participants learned basics of bee ecology, beekeeping supplies (bee suits and gloves) and how to use them and how to create a bee-friendly environment. Highlights included beekeeping demonstrations, honey recipes and garden tips.



Education Without Barriers Through Transformational Partnerships

Boys State held their annual summer conference on NJC's campus starting June 3-10 followed by Girls State on June 14-20. In both cases, around 150 students and 30 mentors stayed in the Williams and GRB Residence Halls, ate in the Chuckwagon Café, and utilized the E.S. French Hall with some overflow into the Hays Student Center. As an incentive, the NJC Foundation and NJC offered some scholarships to the attendees, and both Boys State and Girls State have committed to return in 2024!

Northeastern's Applied Technology Campus hosted a training seminar for Northeast Colorado high school agriculture teachers focused on engine fundamentals on June 19 and June 27, 2023. NJC Automotive and Diesel Instructors, Layton Peterman and Jason Rohm provided an interactive learning experience with hands-on activities to reinforce the fundamental engine concepts. Each participant was given a set of diagnostic tools for their classroom to help them teach engine basics to their students. The goal of this program was to provide additional knowledge and resources that can be used in teaching high school students about rebuilding engines from complete tear down to reassembly for ag mechanics classes.

Northeastern held Registration Days on May 24, June 21, July 15 and August 9. On May 24, sixty-two students were on campus with their families and registered for fall classes. June 21 brought sixty-six new students to campus for registration activities. Fifty-nine students registered on the Saturday, July 15 registration day. On August 9, 81 students were registered for fall classes.

They are able to access physicians, therapists, psychiatrists, and nutritionists, all free and unlimited. They are able to schedule appointments by time or by provider and are able to choose providers by specialty area, gender, ethnicity/race, or language. They also have access to financial wellness (financial advice) and a discount prescription program.

This competition field will support NJC and Sterling High School games. Prior to this field, NJC used the high school field which barely met league size requirements.
