## **Create Education without Barriers through Transformational Partnerships**

Otero College today announced a new strategic partnership with ed2go, a leading provider of adult online education and part of Cengage Group, to expand online training opportunities across in-demand industries. Otero College will offer a number of affordable online courses through the agreement. ed2go partners with several academic institutions to provide innovative, relevant courses that align with job market demand and cover a variety of industries such as IT and Computer Science, Languages, Business, and Health and Fitness Programs ranging from career and certification training to personal and professional development courses focusing on teaching transferable and in-demand skills. The fully online model allows students to learn anytime, anywhere. Students have the option for self-paced and instructor-led courses and have opportunities for collaboration with instructors and other learners.

With the help of ed2go, students can advance their career prospects with a certification from Otero College. Students will not have to apply for admission at Otero but will go directly through ed2go. Once they have finished their online education, they will receive a certificate from Otero College acknowledging that they have completed their program of choice. These courses provided by ed2go are considered non-credit and are not a part of Otero's academic program curriculum. Payment is due at the time of registration. These courses are not eligible for financial aid. Otero College is now the host of two, dual-port Electric Vehicle charging stations. Anyone that owns a vehicle that can be plugged in, Battery Electric or Plug-In Hybrid, can utilize them. These charging stations are open to all faculty, staff, students, and the public. The cost is \$0.25/kWh.

On Aug. 4, 2021, Otero College was awarded the Charge Ahead Colorado grant to help fund the installation of two dual-port, Level 2 ChargePoint charging stations (CT-4000) on campus. The site selected for these charging stations is the parking lot directly attached to the rear of the McDivitt Center gym – 55 Piñon St. in La Junta.



The Colorado Science and Engineering Fair (CSEF) was held at Colorado State University, Fort Collins at the Lory Student Center April 7-8. There were 215 projects displayed from students in grades 6-12 from across Colorado. Otero College is the host of the Arkansas Valley Regional Science Fair (AVRSF) where the eight students qualified to take their projects to CSEF. They were Makai Chambers, Hoehne; Pace Wallace, Las Animas; Terra McClure, Rocky Ford; Tanner Baker and Jacob Vasquez, Rocky Ford; Drake Coffield-Bamber and Adam Ouattara, La Junta; and Fernanda Pastor-Sepulveda of Rocky Ford, however, she was unable to attend. Several of these students received awards and placed at CSEF. Makai Chambers won the Little Shop of Physics Award as well as the Pioneers of Science Award. He received a certificate, a backpack and \$50. Terra McClure received an Honorable Mention in Math and Computer Sciences. Pace Wallace received the following awards: Colorado Foundation for Ag. Award; the American Meteorological Society - Outstanding Achievement in

Atmospheric Sciences Award; the AIPG Certificate of Excellence in the Geosciences, which came with a \$75 prize; the Colorado Mineral Society Award; the NASA Earth System Science Award; and the Soil and Water Conservation Society Natural Resource Conservation Award which included \$100.

The Classified Staff at Otero hosted their annual plant sale fundraiser on May 4<sup>th</sup> to raise money for student scholarships. They were able to raise \$916.75. She then transferred to Houston Baptist University and was a two-time All-SLC player while earning her Bachelor of Arts in Interdisciplinary Studies, Math & Science.
