#### SKILL ADVANCE COLORADO MLL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

ACC's grant application for the Skill Advance Colorado Mobile Learning Lab Assistance Program has been approved by CCCS and the Colorado Office of Economic Development and International Trade in the amount of \$883,443.66 for the development of a Healthcare Training Mobile Learning Lab. An additional \$300,000 from Douglas County has also been designated for this project, bringing the total grant funding for ACC's mobile health lab to nearly \$1.2 million.

# PRESIDENT FUJII SPEAKS AT WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT SHOWCASE

ACC President <u>Stephanie J. Fujii, Ph.D.</u>, served as a panelist for the "Connections to Higher Education" discussion at the <u>2022 Workforce Development Showcase</u> (sponsored by the South Metro Denver Chamber) on Sept. 28 at the Centennial Airport. Dozens of K-12 educators, college and university administrators, and business executives examined critical topics impacting employment and the future of the south metro Denver workforce.

#### ACC TO JOIN DENVER-METRO ENGINEERING CONSORTIUM

A \$10.9 million grant from the U.S. Department of Defense (Office of Naval Research) is being used to develop a multi-year, year-round pathway for underrepresented students in the Denver metro area to go from high school to community college to a four-year university with the goal of earning an engineering bachelor's degree and entering the STEM workforce (science, technology, engineering and math). Grant funding will pave the way for the development of the Denver-Metro Engineering Consortium (DMEC), which will be comprised of five Denver-area community colleges and two universities in an initiative to increase the number of community college students who pursue engineering careers. The initial DMEC includes CU Boulder (project lead), CU Denver, Community College of Aurora and Community College of Denver, as well as Lockheed Martin. In three years, ACC, Front Range Community College and Red Rocks Community College will join, expanding the consortium to include all five Denver-metro community colleges. FULL STORY

# DOUGLAS COUNTY INVESTS \$2.2M IN ACC

The Board of Douglas County Commissioners has invested over \$2.2 million of the County's American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds in ACC's talent development training, programming and services expansion at the Douglas County School District's Legacy Innovation Campus in Lone Tree. Through the one-time ARPA funding, Douglas County will partner with ACC in support of 1) Acquisition of equipment for ACC's new Advanced Robotics and Automation Lab scheduled to open in the fall of 2023 (\$1,249,790), 2) Construction of a Mobile Health and Medical Skills Lab and EMT Simulation Classroom scheduled to open in summer or fall of 2023 (\$607,850), and 3) Expansion of internships, scholarships and student

support for persons with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD) and those with traumatic brain injury in Douglas County through ACC's Elevate and RISE programs beginning in the fall of 2023 (\$350,000).
