EXPLANATION:

As a step toward creating equitable cultures within CCCS institutions, like many colleges and universities, we have developed a system wide land acknowledgement. On the surface, an Indigenous land acknowledgement is a formal statement an organization uses to recognize that it sits on what was once the land of a Native American tribe. More comprehensively, a land acknowledgement provides CCCS the opportunity to:

- foreground the marginalized history of the institution and its region;
- · raise awareness about ongoing colonialism and land-based injustice; and
- raise awareness about a lack of representation of Indigenous people.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff is present to share the Land Acknowledgment Statement and recommends the State Board, leadership, and staff open all board meetings, public events, and large community gatherings with this statement.
