



Articulation Agreement

Introduction

This Articulation Agreement formally recognizes that San Juan College (SJC) and Diné' College (DC) are higher education institutions and agree to work together to provide educational opportunities for currently enrolled and future students at their institutions. Specifically, this agreement indicates a commitment by both institutions to facilitate the transfer of students between SJC and DC. Specifically, those students who have completed the articulated courses can transfer into the partner program without jeopardizing the intended mission and stated goals of either institution.

Purpose

The agreement defines a structure through which articulation on all levels will be supported. This agreement is specifically designed to allow for the maximum transfer of credit and a smooth transition for students earning a SJC Associate of Science or Associate of Arts Degree into the corresponding DC Bachelor of Science or Bachelor of Arts Degree as described in the Appendices of this document.

Transfer Details and Limitations

San Juan College students must successfully fulfill the Diné College academic and admissions requirements to be admitted into the DC Bachelor of Science or Bachelor of Arts Degree programs.

San Juan College students successfully completing the courses specified in the appendices with a grade of C or better will receive credit towards completion of the corresponding DC Bachelor of Science or Bachelor of Arts Degree as indicated on the Articulation Matrix. Degree requirements for DC that articulate are listed in blue on the left with corresponding SJC degree requirements listed in green on the right. Adjacent courses are considered equivalent in terms of meeting degree requirements. Courses without an adjacent listing do not have an equivalent course at the other institution. Additional courses specifically required to complete the SJC Associates of Science or Associate of Arts degree and courses specifically required to complete the DC Bachelor of Science or Bachelor of Arts degree are listed below the common courses.

San Juan College students transferring to DC will articulate under the Bachelor of Science or Bachelor of Arts Degree requirements that were in effect when they started at SJC, or up to three years before they enroll at DC, whichever is less.

Services Provided by SJC

- SJC advisors will assist students as needed through the DC program admissions process.
- SJC will promote the DC Bachelor of Science and Bachelor of Arts programs listed in the appendices to students interested in transferring to a university.
- SJC will notify DC of any changes to the articulated courses in a timely fashion.

Services Provided by DC

- DC will notify SJC of any changes to the articulated courses in a timely fashion.
- DC will notify SJC of any changes to the degree programs and enrollment processes in a timely fashion.
- DC will provide SJC advisors with marketing materials (e.g. brochures, information bulletins, etc.) regarding the Bachelor of Science and Bachelor of Arts degrees listed in the appendices for distribution to SJC students.

Any written materials published and distributed by SJC or DC which specifically reference the articulation agreement between the two institutions or make any general representation of each other's institution must be approved by each respective party prior to its use. The trademarks and logos of each college may not be used by the other without express written permission.

No financial implications concerning the transfer or exchange of cash, equipment, or real estate is intended or implied by this agreement. Neither is this agreement intended to imply that SJC graduates are guaranteed acceptance to DC academic programs or employment. Rather, the agreement solely guarantees the transfer of credits from SJC courses to the articulated DC programs. SJC and DC are separate and independent institutions of higher education and intend to remain so.

Longevity of Agreement

This agreement will be in effect for five (5) years from the date of execution. Renewal of the agreement with appropriate content changes will be discussed at the end of this time period. Transfer literature will be updated on an annual basis. Termination of this agreement may occur by either party with a ninety (90) day written notification.
