Brandon is part of the WIOA Career Connection program. He had an IEP in high school and felt enrolling in the Career Connection WIOA Youth program would be beneficial to providing him the skills and extra assistance needed in reaching his goals. He has always wanted a career as a web developer in the Information Technology field but wasn't sure where to start. Brandon enrolled in post-secondary education but struggled through some of the classes. He decided to take a break but never gave up on his goal of creating an IT career. He continued working at his non-IT job and was training to become management, but it wasn't what he wanted to do as a career. Easterseals secured a worksite with Rebel IST and Brandon started his virtual paid work experience this summer. Although Brandon's focus was web design, Rebel IST felt it would be beneficial for him to learn the customer service and troubleshooting aspect of IT first since this is a fundamental part of the career. Rebel IST has been an amazing mentor to Brandon suggested some trainings that have become the "industry standard." After Brandon's work experience ended recently, Rebel IST and Brandon asked about extending his paid work experience. In his new work experience, he will be focusing on web development. If Brandon is unable to secure employment with Rebel IST (due to COVID19 hiring limitations), the owner of the company feels confident that the Work Experience and trainings would provide Brandon the credentials to obtain employment in the Information Technology field.
