Charter Schools in Maryland

- Maryland charter schools are public schools operated by independent nonprofit organizations.
- The charter is awarded by the local board of education and grants the school more operational autonomy than non-charter (traditional) public schools.
 - Public charter schools are tuition-free and open to all students.
 - LEAs manage the application, renewal, and revocation/closure processes in a similar manner to traditional nonpublic schools, while honoring the autonomy in the respective charter agreements.

CCPS Charter School Process

Intention Form- Two-page Non-profit, focus, grades served

Prospectus- Mission, needs of community, curricular approach, finances

Charter Agreement - contract that is binding by law and explains in detail the responsibilities of all the parties involved in the implementation of the public charter school.





Charter School Budgeting

-Per Student Allotment (PSA) is given to charter schools
-PSA is determined by the cost per student in the district, minus title funds

-PSA is given quarterly
-Charter school must follow the
same rules and policies for
procurement, etc.
-Charter school creates a budget



Charter School Budgeting

-Budget includes rent/mortgage, utilities, salaries, insurance, MOI, furniture, etc.

-Transportation: \$1,000 per student -2% administrative fee
