RETIREMENT OF JAMES R. BRADLEY RAYMOND A. MASON SCHOOL OF BUSINESS

James (Jim) R. Bradley joined the faculty of William & Mary's Raymond A. Mason School of Business in 2004. He earned his Ph.D. from Stanford University and MBA from Tuck School, Dartmouth College. He has held the Hays T. Watkins Professor of Operations Management and Information Technology since 2011. Prior to joining William & Mary, he taught Manufacturing at Cornell University.

Professor Bradley teaches operations management and information technology at the undergraduate and graduate levels in the Raymond A. Mason School of Business. He was previously on the faculty at the S. C. Johnson Graduate School of Management at Cornell University. He has published scholarly work on capacity management, supply chain management, life cycle management, inventory theory, lean manufacturing, performance measurement, artificial intelligence, and the joint optimization of capacity, inventory, and subcontracting policies. His work makes extensive use of applied probability, optimization, and computer simulation. Prior to earning his Ph.D., Professor Bradley worked for 15 years in manufacturing with General Motors. His consulting clients have included 3M, Digital Equipment Corporation, and the Commonwealth of Virginia Employment Commission.

Professor Bradley led the development of the Master of Business Analytics Program at Raymond A. Mason School of Business at William & Mary, which began in 2016. His teaching focus changed at that time to business analytics, including Python programming for analytics, optimization, and algorithm development. His research focus was similarly reoriented toward data science, including artificial intelligence, neural networks, and the control of multiple agents.

Professor Bradley has received multiple awards for his teaching and service at William & Mary, including the Master of Science in Business Analytics Class of 2017 Faculty Excellence Award, the Alfred N. Page Teaching Award, Master of Science in Business Analytics, the McGlothlin Teaching Award in 2016, and the Daniel C. Lewis Award for Exceptional Service.

Bradley, expresses its profound appreciation for his many contributions to William & Mary; and approves, with deep gratitude for his twenty years of service, a change in status from Hays T.
