 Mr. Akomolafe shared that during the month of February, the DCDSB, like many organizations across the country, celebrates Black History Month.
- Highlights from his presentation include:

- Acknowledging and celebrating the contributions, culture, history, and achievements of Black students, staff, families, and communities every day.
- To increase representation, participation, and belonging for Black employees, the Black Heritage and Excellence Celebration Committee organizes staff-led and stafffocused events that highlight the contributions of Black Canadians.
- The board will continue working to further the relationship with the Black community through the DCDSB Anti-Black Racism & Black Excellence Advisory Committee, community-based organizations, Black professional organizations and other organizations that work to dismantle anti-Black racism and address other forms of discrimination experienced by Black students, staff, and families. The DCDSB Equity Invitational Learning Series is one of the ways the board collaborates with the community towards dismantling anti-Black racism and systemic discrimination in education.

The Student Trustees provided the following report:

- Intro (Aoife): Student councils had a successful month in December running their art showcases and semi formals, ending the year 2023 on a happy note! Our school communities have been having a great start to the new year, and with upcoming exams, it has been a busy month for all. We are wishing the best of luck for students with their exams.
- Senate (Aoife): At our Senate meeting (Jan 15) we had a productive and educational meeting with Dr. Clark and the Intergenerational Hub, who came and gave us a presentation on their plans for an upcoming Career Panel event happening at our board for black students. The Senate will be assisting the Intergenerational Hub with spreading the word about this event and attracting student interest. Our Senators plus presidents also had the opportunity to ask Dr. Clark questions, and he was more than willing to answer them, engaging in meaningful discussions with the senators. Our Communications subcommittee has also put out our December Senate star post, as well as a post giving students tips for their upcoming exams. Our Student Senate hopes to host a Student

Voices Forum in Early April as well as visits to seven elementary schools all in hopes to help build awareness of Senate, spark initiatives for students to bring back to their schools, give students tools to successfully carry out initiatives, tools for leadership and learn how senate can improve our advocacy.

- OSTA-AECO (Moyin): Typically, OSTA-AECO holds an annual board councils conference in February. However, since the restructuring of the organization, seeing as there are no longer board councils, this conference is now called the Education Action Conference (EAC). I am a member of the Education and Curriculum Advocacy Interest Group which focuses on the improvement of education for the interests of student success in Ontario. As a group, our goal is to create equitable education that will allow students to attain knowledge and reach their full potential.  - 3.1.1. Ad hoc Committee for Enhancing the Use of Public Transit

Motion:

B2024-01-22-04 – Ad hoc Committee for Enhancing the Use of Public Transit

"Whereas, since the 1960's until 2014, the bussing of the majority of high school students to and from Durham schools was handled efficiently by the municipal transit agencies through the use of bus tickets/passes; the municipal operators were Ajax-Pickering Transit, Whitby Transit, Oshawa Transit and Clarington Transit, later amalgamated into Durham Region Transit (DRT) in 2006;

Whereas, in 2014, Durham Region Transit raised the cost of the monthly bus pass significantly and the school boards assumed responsibility for transporting eligible high school students on yellow school buses through its consortium Durham Student Transportation Services (DSTS);

Whereas, for the last few years, pre- and post-pandemic, school bus operators across Ontario have had difficulty finding and retaining a sufficient number of school bus drivers;

Whereas many transit agencies in the province (Toronto, York Region, Ottawa, Kingston) have a high percentage of high school students using public transit to travel to and from school, and more boards and transit agencies are considering similar arrangements;

Whereas DSTS continues to maximize the efficiency of its system using the resources it has, in the fall of 2021, Durham District School Board (DDSB) and Durham Catholic District School Board (DCDSB) sought an expanded relationship between DRT and

DSTS. A public delegation was made to the Transit Executive Committee of Durham Region on December 8, 2021, with the intention of explaining the benefits of transit passes for high school students; negotiating a lower rate for DRT passes currently purchased by DSTS; and a strategy to have more high school students given monthly DRT transit passes;

- commitment to capacity building and lifelong learning. We are focused on serving the best interests of our students and our Durham Catholic community.
- We are pleased to confirm that the new addition at St. Anne Catholic School in Oshawa opened on Monday, January 8, 2024, and students and staff are now using the new classrooms. As you know, over the past year, a new wing was built at St. Anne Catholic School creating an additional 184 student spaces, through the support of a \$4.8 million investment from the Ontario Government. The addition of eight new classrooms at the school provides much needed student spaces in north Oshawa, where we have seen extraordinary growth over the past few years. We express our sincere thanks and congratulations to Superintendent Grieve and the Facilities Services team for their work on this project.
- We continue to focus on the mental health and well-being of our students, staff and community at DCDSB. On January 24, we will recognize Bell Let's Talk Day, to encourage students, staff and families to open up conversation about mental health in order to lessen the stigma and build understanding, so that much needed supports can be accessed by those in need. We want to make sure that our students are aware and can access the mental health supports which are always available. We hope to foster the type of environments where our students are able to reach out to any trusted adult who can support them and assist them with connecting with the help that they need. Students, parents and families unsure about where to go or who to talk to, can always seek support through the DCDSB Social Work Access Line. There are also resources available on our website.
- I want to take a moment to acknowledge and thank our psychology staff, including our board Psychologist, Psychological Associates, Psychometrists, and Board Certified Behaviour Analysts. Please join us in recognizing Durham Catholic psychology staff on February 5th, when we celebrate Psychology Staff Appreciation Day.
- The fifth annual National Catholic Health Care Week will take place from February 4-10. This celebration then leads us into The World Day of the Sick on February 11, which is a Catholic day of observance established by Pope John Paul II to encourage prayers and reflection about those who are ill and for all those who care for them. This year's National Catholic Health Care Week theme is Building Bridges, which speaks to the gift of Catholic health as a sign of hope in the world and offers each person in their journey to care for themselves or others some words of blessing and hope.
