Proposed CEDS Process and Timeline

July - August 2022

- Facilitate stakeholder interviews
- Compile refreshed data that tells the story of the St. Paul community and economy
- Review relevant documents including recent reports, studies, and plans from partners
- Conduct community survey

September - November 2022

- Develop refreshed vision, goals, strategies
- Convene key partners for a collaborative work session to review, refine, and prioritize strategies and identify actions
- Release the CEDS for a 30-day public comment period
- Finalize the CEDS
