PURPOSE

Board Policy 1A.1 Minnesota State Colleges and Universities Organization and Administration, Part 6. Board Policies and System Procedures requires board review and approval of proposed board policy changes and that each board policy is reviewed at least once every five years.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The proposed amendment consists mostly of technical edits, and the application of new formatting and writing standards. After consultation with Jen Dobossy, System Director for Foundation Services, and the Office of General Counsel, a separate paragraph was added at the beginning of Part 2. This paragraph clarifies that the language in that part does not apply to college and university affiliated foundations, as long as there is a signed contract in place between the foundation and the college/university. Additionally, a few minor changes were made to improve the clarity and brevity of the policy- in Part 2, the language "whose primary activity is" was replaced with "that" for brevity purposes, and in Part 3, the language "not prohibited" was replaces with "allowed" for additional clarity.

5.15 Fundraising Principles

Part 1. Policy Statement-

It is the policy of the Board of Trustees that any eColleges, universitiesy, and the system office shall conducting fund-raising and/or gambling events shall do so in accordance with the following principles and guidelines.

Part 2. Fundraising Principles and Guidelines-Guidelines-

The related foundations are private, non-profit organizations that have a primary responsibility for fundraising on behalf of a college or university and are recognized by a signed written contract between the college/university and foundation. If a foundation has such a contract in place, it is exempt from any further requirements under this part. If a foundation has a signed contract in place between the foundation and the college or university it supports, no further approval is required.

Other Organizations whose primary activity is tothat solicit funds publicly on behalf of the Minnesota State Colleges and Universities or its institutions shall obtain the approval of the chancellor for the system office and or the approval of the president for a college or university before using the college's or university's name or facilities to solicit funds. If a foundation has a signed contract in place between the foundation and the college or university it supports, no further approval is required.

Organizations whose primary activity is not fundraising but which that occasionally provide funds to the Minnesota State Colleges and Universities are not covered by these principles guidelines unless their fundraising efforts involve the use of the college or university's name and facilities. However, the Minnesota State Colleges and Universities neither endorses nor disapproves efforts by private sector external groups to engage in such fundraising activities when those activities are associated with the sale of goods and services.

The relationship of the Minnesota State Colleges and Universities to fundraising efforts for intercollegiate athletics must shall be in strict compliance with applicable rules and regulations of any intercollegiate athletic association or conference of which the college or university is a member.

Part 3. Gambling-

Except as provided in this policy, no gambling or betting, as commonly understood and/or defined in Minnesota Statutes, Chapter Minn. Stat. Ch.Sec. 609.75-609.76 is allowed on college, university, or system property.

Raffles are not prohibitedallowed by this policy if:

- a. The raffle is conducted by a college, university, or system office, or related groups; and
- b. Prizes are donated by an individual, firm, or other organization such as foundations and auxiliary boosters; and

c. The raffle meets the requirements of Minnesota Statutes section Minn. Stat. § 349.166.

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Part 4. Accountability/Reporting-

- 47 An annual accounting will be provided to the Board of Trustees upon request of the receipt and
- 48 disposition of funds or gifts-in-kind contributed to the system, colleges, or universities, or
- 49 <u>system office</u> as provided for in Board Policy 7.7, Gifts and Grants Acceptance.

Part 2. Fundraising Guidelines

The related foundations are private, non-profit organizations that have a primary responsibility for fundraising on behalf of a college or university and are recognized by a signed written contract between the college/university and foundation. If a foundation has such a contract in place, it is exempt from any further requirements under this part.

Other organizations that solicit funds publicly on behalf of the Minnesota State Colleges and Universities or its institutions shall obtain the approval of the chancellor for the system office or the approval of the president for a college or university before using the college's or university's name or facilities to solicit funds.

Organizations that occasionally provide funds to Minnesota State are not covered by these principles unless their fundraising efforts involve the use of the college or university's name and facilities. Minnesota State neither endorses nor disapproves efforts by external groups to engage in such fundraising activities when those activities are associated with the sale of goods and services.

The relationship of Minnesota State colleges and universities to fundraising efforts for intercollegiate athletics must be in compliance with applicable rules and regulations of any intercollegiate athletic association or conference of which the college or university is a member.

Part 3. Gambling

Except as provided in this policy, no gambling or betting, as commonly understood and/or defined in Minn. Stat. Sec. 609.75- is allowed on college, university, or system property.

Raffles are allowed by this policy if:

- a. The raffle is conducted by a college, university, or system office, or related groups; and
- b. Prizes are donated by an individual, firm, or other organization such as foundations and auxiliary boosters; and
- c. The raffle meets the requirements of Minn. Stat. § 349.166.

Part 4. Accountability/Reporting

An annual accounting will be provided to the Board of Trustees upon request of the receipt and disposition of funds or gifts-in-kind contributed to the colleges, universities, or system office as provided for in Board Policy 7.7 Gifts and Grants Acceptance.
