His family said he always spoke with enthusiasm about his experiences at CCA and how his education prepared him well for his service as an EMT with Northglenn Ambulance and as a wildland firefighter with the U.S. Department of the Interior. His family created a website, called "The Jon-Alec Fund," where anyone can donate to further someone's career in the fields of emergency medical services, wildland firefighting, or addiction counseling.

Colorado Film School, Hicks Named Among Top 50 by Variety

Variety named Colorado Film School (CFS) Faculty **Will Hicks** one of the world's top film instructors. As part of its "<u>Variety Entertainment Impact Report: Top 50 Film Schools and Instructors From Around the World,</u>" Variety profiled Hicks and wrote: "Hicks brings a wealth of insight to his role as Colorado Film School's head of Screenwriting/Producing Program — none more important than facilitating an environment where artists learn and develop the confidence to express themselves authentically." CFS is regularly named one of the top 50 films schools each year in Variety's annual report on education.

Center for Math and English Launches Institute for Excellence in Teaching and Learning

The Center for Math and English launched its Institute for Excellence in Teaching and Learning (formerly known as the Department of Instructional Intervention and Support) July 1. As with the Department of Instructional Intervention and Support, the Institute for Excellence in Teaching and Learning will support faculty and instructor development. The department will expand its professional development offerings this academic year



and invite staff to partner with the department to facilitate various workshops on topics such as equity, inclusion, student centeredness, classroom techniques/strategies, course modalities-HyFlex, effectively using technology in the classrooms, effective online learning environments, assessment, and more.

Center for Adult Education Prepares for Return of Mostly In-Person Classes CCA's Center for Adult Education will begin a majority return to in-person classes as it launches its 10-week fall term on October 2, with registration beginning in September. The Center, which includes the Community ESL and High School Equivalency/GED programs, will offer on-campus classes weekdays and Saturdays, and a small offering of remote classes weekday mornings and evenings. Throughout CCA's remote period, the Center designed and implemented a Center-driven registration process, which allowed for significant retention of students and enrollment of new students—the Center's concerted efforts prompted its continued success in otherwise trying times. Furthermore, the Center has maintained contact with its student body (receiving an outpouring of interest) and is now poised for an increase in enrollment for on-campus classes in the fall term.

Baral to Serve as Interim Math Chair

Chuda Baral will serve as the Interim Department Chair for the Math Department. Baral joined CCA in 2015 as an instructor and became a full-time faculty member in 2018. Prior to joining CCA, Chuda taught at Aurora Central High School and the Community College of Denver and also worked at Denver Public Schools. Some of his goals as a faculty member are to use Open Educational Resources (OER) to increase student success and minimize student financial burdens. Former Math Chair **Shelly Ray** retired in May.

While her research was already underway, <u>Cook's Mellon/American Council of Learned Societies Community College Faculty Fellowship award in 2019 contributed to her scholarship and completion of research for the book. Cook and Joseph are actively writing the book, which they describe as: "The story of how fandom has changed the world for good, and a guide to using the power of fandom to inspire others, organize collective action, and sustain and nurture your own mental health and creativity. Cook and Joseph conducted a multi-year ethnographic study on fan activism. They bring sociological and psychological knowledge to this informative how to." The book is expected to be published in November 2022.</u>
