


Additionally, a Welcome Fair was set up in the LCC Learning Garden to greet students, give directions, hand out a little swag and help get them started 'on the right foot'


SGA officers

IREPO Grant

LCC was notified August 2 that the college is one of only 62 institutions nationally, and one of only three in Colorado, awarded a federal Institutional Resilience and Expanded Postsecondary Opportunity (IREPO) grant. Titled "Within and Beyond the Pandemic: Ensuring Equity and Access in the Rural Digital Divide through Expanded Remote Instruction and Distance Learning", this two-year \$1.57 million dollar grant provides staffing and resources to better serve LCC's far-flung service area.
