• ACC ELEVATE PARTNERS WITH THE DIVISION OF VOCATIONAL REHABILITATION

Elevate has developed a partnership with the Colorado Division of Vocational Rehabilitation (DVR) to provide direct, intentional pre-vocational support services to our students. This partnership has created a revenue stream that contributes to overall sustainability of the

Elevate program. We are working collaboratively with DVR and families over the summer to get new students approved for services and develop individualized plans for employment. DVR is a division of the Colorado Department of Labor and Employment (CDLE) that provides individualized services for people with disabilities to allow them to reach their employment goals.

PROPERTY MANAGEMENT APPRENTICESHP FEATURED BY HOA RESOURCES

ACC's Property Management Apprenticeship Program was the subject of a feature article in HOA Resources in Aug. 2021. ACC partnered with the Community Associations Institute (CAI) - Rocky Mountain Chapter and local workforce development agencies in Aug. 2020 to establish a first-of-its-kind apprenticeship program for the community association management profession. ACC piloted a cohort of 15 apprentices last fall for a paid, two-year apprenticeship program comprised of up to 40 hours/week of on-the-job training. Apprentices earn a stackable ACC certificate in Business Administration, as well as a pair of industry credentials, with minimal college debt. Those who successfully complete the program are qualified to become a professional Community Association Manager.
