

- Rankings: High HERD ranking relative to FTE student ratio


# USU serves more part-time students than all other land grants




# USU student enrollment relative to proposed peers

# USU research expenditures relative to proposed peers


The total amount of research and development expenditures: amounts in thousands FY 2022

Colorado State is a peer institution in nearly every way. While slightly larger than USU, with most of the difference in the graduate programs.

- Similar acceptance rates (91% to 94%)
- Fewer percentage of Pell students than USU
- 25% higher tuition (sticker price)
- More than double the number of graduate students
- Spends more per FTE on instruction and support
- Highest HERD ranking of all peers

- Only 10% of students are part time (lowest of all peers)
- 33% more graduate FTE than USU
- Spends 75% more per FTE on academic support
- Comparable, but slighter better HERD ranking

#### **Peer Findings**

A land grant with both a law school and medical school, but Kentucky looks surprisingly a lot like USU. Similar undergraduate headcount with low selectivity and high HERD ranking.

- Same acceptance rates
- Nearly twice as many graduate FTE
- Spends 50% more per FTE on academic support
- Comparable, but better HERD ranking
- Much more expensive tuition which leads to a much larger core revenue

- Higher proportion of part-time students than other peers, but lower than USU
- 31% higher tuition than USU
- Spends less per FTE on instruction and support, but has higher student outcomes
- Very low HERD ranking

- 29% higher tuition (sticker price)
- About twice the number of graduate students
- Spends similar amount per FTE on instruction but
  24% more on student support
- 16 slots behind USU in HERD ranking

- Slightly fewer percentage of Pell students than USU
- Only about 27% more graduate FTE
- Spends similar amount per FTE on instruction but
  24% more on student support; much higher student outcomes
- 16 slots behind USU in HERD ranking


