- The office will be moving to implement the changes necessary to meet the requirements of the Safety Act/Pretrial Fairness Act that will be fully implemented on September 18, 2023.
- The State's Attorney and Public Defender's Offices will be implementing Karpel, the new case management software, during the week of 9/18/23.
- The office has had 219 new felony cases filed so far in 2023.
- B. Quarterly Update on the Collection of Unpaid Fines State's Attorney In September \$4,517.15 was collected in unpaid fines. A total of \$47,538.45 has been collected so far in 2023.

XII. Report of Abandoned Property Focus Group

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Lee County Sheriff's Office

August 14, 2023

In the month of August, the Lee County Sheriff's Office logged 808 calls for service. The county is also in contract negotiations with the Illinois Fraternal Order of Police prior to the expiration of the contract on November 30th. The next scheduled meeting between the parties is on September 21st.

As far as notable calls for the month of August, the sheriff's office received a report of a missing suicidal subject on August 15th from the West Brooklyn area. The Richardson Wildlife Foundation is in close proximity to the residence of the individual. The sheriff's office continues to provide due diligence with this investigation. Deputies have utilized K-9 teams, drones, and ATVs in the search of the area. At this point, the efforts have been to no avail.
