EMS Billing

When the City made the switch to Delta Medical Transport (DMT) providing our EMS services for our community, I was searching for a way to efficiently billing for EMS services. The Finance Department as struggled with questions that we have received regarding billing charges. In my research I found the City was not set up to bill Medicaid/Medicare. DMT recommended that we look as using a billing service and that I contact Systems Design West. I have started the process to get the City set up a contract with Systems Design to perform our EMS billing for the City. Systems Design will charge \$35 per run. This fee may seem high however typical runs will be at minimum of \$700 per run. Given the City does not have the staff with the expertise to conduct follow up with questions regarding billing it makes financial sense to contract with System Design who does just EMS billing.

The City had to apply for our own National Provider Identifier in order to bill Medicaid/Medicare. This process took a bit of time but is completed. We expect to start properly billing for our EMS services using Systems Design by January 1, 2022.
