

II Transform our Own Workforce Experience

A. CNCC Cabinet recently approved a tuition reimbursement program for full time employees pursuing any credential that aligns with institutional mission and goals and/or their position with the College.

III Create Education Without Barriers Through Transformational Partnerships

- A. Small Home Project-Craig- CNCC is partnering with local elected officials, taxing board members and state organizations to planning affordable housing at it's Craig location. The college was notified it received a planning grant that will provide knowledge regarding the project's viability. CNCC will identify by August 2024 whether this project will move forward, providing potential students with affordable, accessible housing while they pursue their studies. Employees at CNCC, Moffat Schools and the Hospital will benefit from the project as it will afford them short term housing as they look for an affordable place within the community to live.
- **B.** Living/Learning Community Project- Rangely CNCC is partnering with local elected officials, taxing board members and state organizations to planning affordable housing at it's Rangely location. The college is pursuing CDS funds to create adult learning and short term community living space as well as business and entrepreneurial training and education spaces. Prospective CNCC students, employees at CNCC, Rangely Schools and Hospital employees

- will benefit from the project as it will afford them short term housing as they look for an affordable place within the community to live.
- C. Lisa Jones served on a two-person panel facilitated by the Associate Director of Postsecondary Education for the National Conference of State Legislators- This convening was on Postsecondary Career and Technical Pathways. Opportunities, and Challenges in CTE education and barriers and outcomes of students who pursue this training. Sixty -three legislators representing the following states joined: New Mexico, Ohio, Wyoming, Idaho, Tennessee, Washington, Illinois, Arkansas, Hawaii, Michigan, Delaware, Florida, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Mississippi, California, Kentucky, Colorado, Virginia, South Carolina, Nebraska, as well NCSL's foundation sponsors and business / nonprofit organizations.
