Dear Mr. Kirk,

This letter responds to your May 10, 2024, request for a Department of the Army (DA) jurisdictional determination for your utility upgrade project. It has been assigned number POA-2024-00245, Bering Sea, which should be referred to in all correspondence with us. The project site is located within Section 25, T. 35 S, R. 132 W, Seward Meridian; at Latitude 57.1236 N, Longitude -170.27897° W, in St. Paul, Alaska.

Based on our review of the information you provided, we have determined the project area does not contain waters of the United States (U.S.) under Corps of Engineers (Corps) jurisdiction. Therefore, a DA permit is not required. A copy of the AJD letter is enclosed and available at

This AJD is valid for a period of five (5) years from the date of the AJD form, unless new information supporting a revision is provided to us before the expiration date.

Enclosed is a Notification of Administrative Appeal Options and Process and Request for Appeal form regarding this approved jurisdictional determination (see section labeled "Approved Jurisdictional Determination").

Section 404 of the Clean Water Act requires that a DA permit be obtained for the placement or discharge of dredged and/or fill material into waters of the U.S., including jurisdictional wetlands (33 U.S.C. 1344). The Corps defines wetlands as those areas that are inundated or saturated by surface or groundwater at a frequency and duration sufficient to support, and under normal circumstances do support, a prevalence of vegetation typically adapted for life in saturated soil conditions.

Section 10 of the Rivers and Harbors Act of 1899 requires that a DA permit be obtained for structures or work in or affecting navigable waters of the U.S. (33 U.S.C. 403). Section 10 waters are those waters subject to the ebb and flow of the tide shoreward to the mean high water mark, and/or other waters identified by the Alaska District.

Nothing in this letter excuses you from compliance with other Federal, State, or local statutes, ordinances, or regulations.

B. REQUIRED ADDITIONAL COMMENTS TO SUPPORT JD. EXPLAIN RATIONALE FOR DETERMINATION THAT THE REVIEW AREA ONLY INCLUDES DRY LAND: The review area includes the proposed project footprint, which consists of the areas to be trenched to install new electrical lines, sewer and water pipes. (see Figure 1). The project area is directly adjacent to tidal waters of the Bering Sea, but no work will be done below the High Tide Line (HTL). Recent and historical aerial imagery from 2014 to 2024 indicates that the entire review area consists of buildings and gravel fill, with minimal vegetative cover. No depressional features or ponding water or snow were observed. The review area is surrounded by a gravel road and some residential and commercial buildings; the sparse vegetation in adjacent areas appears to be shrubs or grasses. Based on the best information available, the Corps has determined that there are no wetlands present within the review area and that the three criteria required to classify an area as wetland (hydrology, hydrophytic vegetation and hydric soils) are not satisfied.
