



WSU Retention Council:

The WSU Retention Council is a system-based council that is charged with developing actionable principles and methods to improve the overall retention rates of WSU Students. First constituted in 2023, the Retention Council is being reconstituted under the leadership of Enrollment Management, the Provost's Office, and Student Affairs with a renewed focus of examining and developing four key student focus areas.

The Retention Council is developing a core set of principles across four focus areas that cross all institutional boundaries. The Council will better align activities currently used and review policies and procedures to make sure that there is consistency in the student experience.



FUTURE EFFORTS

Four Areas of Focus:

- Academic Advising Review the academic advising program to ensure consistency, clarity of message, and closing of equity gaps among advisors.
- Sense of Belonging Ensure that WSU students have opportunities, activities and spaces that allow for them to develop their personal Coug Experience.
- **Fiscal Support** Eliminate low-cost Institutional fiscal barriers that prevent students from registering and progressing.
- Early Warning Systems and Basic Needs Improve the efficacy and coverage of the early-warning systems at WSU and connect WSU students to established basic needs resources in place.



NEXT STEPS

- There is a lot of good retention work happening already, but we need to focus on:
 - Building a shared vision of student success across campuses, colleges and departments
 - Coordinating areas around that vision and breaking down silos
 - The use of technology in student success efforts
 - Broadening Retention Council membership
 - Partnering with external organizations to provide supplementary support and expertise
