I. <u>Call to Order</u> Meeting was called to order at 3:00 p.m., by Chair Tom Willson

II. <u>Committee Member Roll Call: Chair Tom Wilson, Vice Chair Dean Freil, Jack Skrogstad,</u> <u>Chris Robertson, Mike Pearson</u>

Tom Wilson, Dean Freil, Jack Skrogstad, and Chris Robertson all attended in person. Mike Pearson attended via Zoom video conferencing.

Also present: Jeremy Englund (Administrator), Alice Henkel (Zoning Administrator), Jeff Hilden (Facilities Director), and Becky Brenner (Board Secretary) all attended in person.

Discussion during roll call:

Alice Henkel explained that during the hearing for Steward Creek Solar the use of battery energy storage was questioned because the County is currently under a moratorium for battery energy storage. Alice wanted to make sure that all the Board Members were aware that the moratorium was for stand-alone systems only. Last year when the state introduced their new citing standards for wind and solar, they allowed for battery energy storage as an accessory to a wind or solar project.

V. <u>Maintenance Department Report / Facility Improvement Updates</u>

- A. Maintenance Department Report
 - Tom Wilson and Jeff Hilden reported the following items:
 - State's Attorney's Office carpet project is ongoing but nearly half finished
 - The Zoning Office is currently being painted
 - The department is working to find the best technique to clean and shine the brass stair railings in the Old Courthouse
 - Housekeeping in the Old Courthouse is in the process of cleaning all of the woodwork with lemon oil
 - The elevator project in the Old Courthouse is now scheduled to start on Monday, March 18, 2024

- If the elevator project starts on March 18th, the County Board Meeting will most likely be held in the New Courts Building EOC Training Center
- The department has logged and completed 697 preventative maintenance tasks in the new software in the last three (3) months
- 67 work requests were received
- 91% of their work right now is preventative maintenance
- Treasurer's Office remodel is completed except for a few incidentals
- New Courts was the recipient of a \$1,016,623.10 technology grant that will outfit the existing courtrooms and the new grand jury courtroom
