

Proposal for the Creation of an Industry Led Advisory Committee for the Trades

Purpose: The primary purpose of the Industry Led Advisory Committee for the Trades is to assist CCHEC in establishing, operating, and evaluating our Career & Technical Education (CTE) programs, which serves the needs of the students, the community, and the business/industry partners, and to provide expertise and insight about current/future industry and technological changes.

Three potential roles: Advise, Assist, Advocate

Benefits for CCHEC include credibility in industry and with our community & partners, invaluable advice and knowledge, and additional connections to the community for students, staff, and CCHEC as a whole. CCHEC's strategic initiatives include a focus on continuous improvement and on maintaining relevant programming and relevance to the community.

Benefits for industry partners include direct access to student talent at CCHEC, firsthand information from instructors regarding courses and curriculum, influence over the training that students receive, and the opportunity to strengthen valuable professional connections with other industry leaders and CCHEC.
