## Dear State Psychology Board Representative:

My name is Elliot Lasson. I am a Licensed Psychologist and the Chair of APA Division 14's (Society for I/O Psychology/SIOP's) Licensure Certification, and Credentialing (LCC) Committee. My portfolio includes keeping tabs on the licensure landscape for I/O Psychologists. While this is a specific niche, a similar issue is licensure is relevant for other General Applied Psychologists (GAP's).
