R765-803263.1. Purpose.

This rule establishes a procedure <u>and review process</u> whereby a student enrolled in a <u>public-Utah System of Higher Education</u> institution <u>of higher education</u> may petition the Utah Board of Higher Education to review a policy that directly affects the student's enumerated civil liberties, which the student believes the institution adopted without first establishing an administrative rule governing the enumerated civil liberty.

This rule is authorized by Subsection 53B-27-303(1).

R765.803263.3. Review Process.

- (1) Any students enrolled at a <u>public Utah System of Higher Education</u> institution of higher education who believes the institution has adopted a policy that directly impacts one of the the student's enumerated civil liberties but which is not governed by an existing administrative rule may petition the Utah Board of Higher Education for a review.
- (2) To file a petition for review, the student shall send a written request that identifies the policy for which a review is requested to: review@ushe.edu.-Within 30 days of receiving the complaint, the Office of the Commissioner of Higher Education, on behalf of the Utah Board of Higher Education, shall:
 - (a) review the petition to determine if it is made in good faith;
 - (b) dismiss the petition if it is made in bad faith;
- (c) determine if the institution has established an administrative rule that adopts or governs the <u>institution's</u> policy; and
- (d) if the institution lacks a governing administrative rule, direct the institution to initiate rulemaking within 60 days of the decision.
