Re: Collegiate High School Updates

The Collegiate High School's 2022-2023 School Year culminated with a 100% high-school graduation rate and the following accolades to report:

Collegiate High School Senior, Sean Arbuckle, was one of only fifteen students awarded a \$10,000 Phi Theta Kappa's 2023 Hites Transfer Scholarship, the Society's largest scholarship offering. This is the first NWFSC student to win this prestigious award in the history of the scholarship.
