APPENDIX E

EXPANDING DUAL ENROLLMENT FOR STUDENTS NOT MEETING STATUTORY ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

NWFSC agrees to conduct a pilot for the 2024 academic year that will allow Walton County High School students in the Walton County School District, Florida to take dual enrollment courses prior to meeting statutory eligibility requirements based on the following guidelines.

1. Who is eligible to participate:

- Students who attend Walton High School in grades, 10, 11, or 12;
- Students who are in good academic standing;
- Students who have not attempted any courses through dual enrollment; and
- Students who have a cumulative unweighted GPA between 2.5 and 2.99.

2. Courses that may be taken:

- College Success – SLS 1101
- Fitness and Wellness – HLP 1081

3. Location of Courses:

- Courses will be taught on the campus of Walton High School. (The appropriate NWFSC Department Chair will verify that Instructors for these courses meet adjunct instructor qualifications as outlined by NWFSC).

4. Course Load:

- Students may take up to 6 credit hours under this pilot agreement.
- Students may take one course per term from the courses listed above in section two (2) based on the high school's ability to offer these courses.
- Students who attempt a course in the Fall Term (202410) must complete the course with a grade of C or higher to take a second course in the Spring Term (202420).

5. Student Processes:

- Students must follow all of the processes set forth in the approved 2023-2024 Articulation Agreement between NWFSC and Walton County School District.
- All new dually enrolled students must apply for admission to NWFSC for the term in which they plan to attend (Fall 202410 or Spring 202420) using the link on the dual enrollment page www.nwfsc.edu/dual.
- Students must provide placement scores in Reading, writing and math; students will be allowed to take the courses above with scores that fall below the minimum requirements.
- Students must ensure they are able to login with their Raider credentials to RaiderNet and College email.
- Students must use Dynamic Forms to complete the Registration Process as outlined in Appendix A.

Participation under this Pilot offers no guarantee that a student may continue to dual enroll after the Spring 2024 semester. Students who become dually enrolled under these guidelines should continue to work toward achieving the 3.0 GPA and the minimum placement scores.
