PURPOSE

Board Policy 1A.1 Minnesota State Colleges and Universities Organization and Administration, Part 6. Board Policies and System Procedures requires board review and approval of proposed board policy changes and that each board policy is reviewed at least once every five years.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The proposed amendment consists of reorganizing the current language within the policy, creating an introductory paragraph for Part 1 and a new Part 1, Subp. B, and deleted "Gender" from the title in Part 2.

RECOMMENDED ACTION (SECOND READING DRAFT)

The Academic and Student Affairs Committee recommends that the Board of Trustees approve the proposed amendment to Policy 2.6.

PROPOSED CHANGES (SECOND READING DRAFT)

1	2.6 Intercollegiate Athletics
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3	Part 1. Intercollegiate Athletics
4	Consistent with the unique identity and mission of the institution, a college or university may
5	engage in programs of intercollegiate athletics. Each college or university with intercollegiate
6	athletics shall provide athletic opportunities for students in accordance with federal and state
7	requirements.
8	
9	Subpart A. Conference and Division Membership
10	Consistent with the unique identity and mission of the institution, a college or university
11	may engage in programs of intercollegiate athletics. A college or university may join one or
12	more conferences and add or remove sports after a review of the impact on students,
13	finances, the facilities master plan, Title IX compliance, and completion of the student and
14	college/university consultation process. The college or university shall operate according to
15	the rules and standards of the conference as long as such rules are not in conflict with
16	federal or state law, <mark>b</mark> Board <u>of Trustees</u> policies, or system procedures. Adding any sport at
17	the National Collegiate Athletic Association or the National Junior College Athletic
18	Association division-one level requires a recommendation from the chancellor and prior
19	approval by the board.

21	Subpart B. Division I Level Approval Process
22	Adding any division I sport with the National Collegiate Athletic Association or the National
23	Junior College Athletic Association requires board approval.
24	
25	A request for board approval of participation-to participate in a division-one-level sport
26	must be directed to the chancellor or designee and include analysis and review of the
27	expected impact on students, institutional and student services finances, the college's or
28	university's mission and facilities master plan, compliance with equal opportunity
29	requirements, and a report of the consultation process used. Upon review, the chancellor
30	will determine if a request will be presented to the board for consideration.

32	Part 2. Gender Equity in Athletics
33	The Minnesota State colleges and universities are committed to providing equal opportunity in
34	athletics for <u>all</u> students <u>. of all gender identities and gender expressions. Each college or</u>
35	university with intercollegiate athletics shall provide athletic opportunities for students in
36	accordance with federal and state requirements.
37	
38	Part 3. Student Athlete Health Insurance.
39	Students participating in intercollegiate athletics are required to maintain health insurance

40 through a plan or rider that includes coverage for participation in intercollegiate athletics. Prior

- 41 to student participation in intercollegiate athletics, colleges and universities shall provide
- 42 adequate written notice to students of the requirement for health insurance.
