General Education in Florida: A Review

- Students initially entering a Florida College System (FCS) or State University System (SUS) institution are required to complete at least one general education core course in each of the subject disciplines of communication, mathematics, social sciences, humanities and natural sciences (for a total of 15 credits). There are a remaining 24 credits required to fulfill General Education across FCS/SUS.
- The general education core course options are adopted in <u>State Board of</u> <u>Education (SBOE) Rule 6A-14.0303, Florida Administrative Code</u> (F.A.C.), and <u>Board of Governors (BOG) Regulation 8.005</u>.
- In 2023, Senate Bill (SB) 266 modified <u>s. 1007.25, F.S.</u>, creating content standards for each of the five disciplines.
- Additionally, the bill created <u>s. 1007.55, F.S.</u>, to specify content, principles and standards for all general education—every student should graduate as an informed citizen participating in rigorous general education courses that promote and preserve the constitutional republic through traditional, historically accurate & high-quality coursework.

General Education in Florida: Continued

- <u>Section 1007.55</u>, <u>F.S.</u>, now requires public postsecondary institution boards of trustees and presidents to **annually review and approve** general education course requirements offered at their respective institutions.
- Office of K-20 Articulation prepared an individualized report from the Statewide Course Numbering System for each FCS and SUS institution to certify their general education course requirements.
- Each institution is responsible for the review and approval of general education course requirements, at a public meeting, by their board of trustees and president, before submitting their proposed list of general education course requirements to the ACC by September 1 of each year.
- Once reviewed, the institution lists are submitted to the SBOE or BOG, respectively, for review and approval each year by December 1.



New Standards for General Education Core

- May not distort significant historical events or include a curriculum that teaches identity politics, violates s. <u>1000.05</u>, F.S., or is based on theories that systemic racism, sexism, oppression, and privilege are inherent in the institutions of the United States and were created to maintain social, political, and economic inequities.
- Emphasis on education for democratic citizenship and the grounding of students in the Western Tradition or "Great Books" curriculum.
- Added GLY X010 Introduction to Geology and OCE X001 Introduction to Oceanography as options for Natural Sciences Gen Ed Core.
- Added AMH X010 Introductory Survey to 1877 as an option to satisfy Social Sciences for Gen Ed Core and removed SYG X000 Principles of Sociology as a Gen Ed Core course.



New Standards for *all* General Education

- **Promote and preserve the Constitutional Republic** through traditional, historically accurate, and high-quality coursework.
- Whenever applicable, provide instruction on the historical background and **philosophical foundation of Western Civilization** and this nation's historical documents, such as the Declaration of Independence, the U.S. Constitution, etc.
- Provide broad foundational knowledge to help students develop intellectual skills and habits that enable them to become more effective and lifelong learners.
- Not include a curriculum based on unproven, speculative, or exploratory content.
