COMMUNITY COLLEGE OF DENVER: STRATEGIC PLAN AY 20-21¹ SNAPSHOT & EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

AY20-21 was an unusual year due to the pandemic, which impacted our students, our colleges, and our faculty. Nationwide trends saw severe enrollment losses among community colleges, especially for underserved populations such as low-income students and students of color. These losses may be reflected in the strategic plan metrics. Certificates and degrees awarded, fall-to-fall, and fall-to-spring retention all declined from the prior year. Distance and hybrid course pass rates declined over the previous year and remained below the on-campus goal. Credits earned through concurrent enrollment dropped from the previous year, as did the number of certificates and degrees awarded to concurrent enrollment students.

Equity indicators show that students of color, first generation, and Pell eligible students fall slightly below the overall rate of students completing gateway English and Math courses in their first year. These students typically fall below the overall retention, course pass rates, and transfer rates. However, students of color, first generation, and Pell eligible students at CCD all completed student success courses at a higher rate than the overall student population. The overall rate of precipitous decline in GPA from first to second semester decreased compared to last year, and students of color and first generation were less likely to have a precipitous decline in GPA than the overall student population. However, students of color, first generation, and Pell eligible students were more likely to be registered at fall census but have no earned credits for the term than the overall CCD student population.
