# • ACC RECEIVES \$2.2M GRANT FROM U.S. DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION

ACC has been awarded a Title III Part A Strengthening Institutions Program grant in the amount of \$2,244,127 from the U.S. Department of Education. The five-year grant, which will be used to develop the Pathways to Equity, Access to Knowledge (PEAK) program at ACC, began Oct. 1, 2021. The initiative includes three main objectives: 1) Strengthening advising through reduced caseloads and holistic student support and providing individualized academic and career plans; 2) Building a culture of equity and inclusion to reduce course success inequities; 3) Bolstering data analytics and predictive analytics for proactive support of student success and completion. The program helps eligible institutions of higher education to become self-sufficient and expand their capacity to serve low-income students by providing funds to improve and strengthen their academic quality, institutional management, and fiscal stability. ## • ACC and CCD AWARDED \$2M IN COLO. WORKFORCE DESIGN CHALLENGE

ACC and the Community College of Denver, in partnership with Centura Health, HealthONE and DaVita, have been awarded \$2 million through ZOMALAB's SyncUp Colorado Workforce Design Challenge to develop and implement the Colorado Health Careers Collaborative (CHCC). CHCC, a SyncUp mid-stage scale solution, will collectively bring modern apprenticeships and hybrid college approaches to create equitable education-to-employment health career pathways, postsecondary certification, career navigation, and job shadowing opportunities across fast-growing industries in Colorado. CHCC partners also include Beyond Campus Innovations, College Invest Colorado and Arapahoe/Douglas Works!, and well as the Denver, Englewood, Elbert, Kiowa, Littleton, Elizabeth and Cherry Creek school districts. #### ACC TO SERVE AS A LEAD INSTITUTION FOR CO-TECH

ACC will be one of four CCCS institutions to serve as a lead for the new COTECH information technology & cybersecurity apprenticeship program. ACC will be focusing its grant on expanding partnerships and apprenticeship pathways with area technology companies in close collaboration with CyberUp, an established leader in tech apprenticeships in the U.S. that leverages strategic partnerships with colleges, universities and training organizations across the country to grow and scale the cybersecurity workforce. ACC will partner with CyberUp to co-create apprenticeship programs with companies in the south metro Denver area to systemically address their tech talent pipeline challenges.
