Re: Dual Enrollment Articulation Agreement Amendment – Walton County School District

The 2022-2023 Walton County School District Dual Enrollment Articulation Agreement is being amended with course offerings per high school site to replace a common list of courses that high schools may or may not be able to teach based on faculty qualification requirements. The current agreement allows the District to request and provide the four courses on any of their high school campuses: College Algebra, Statistics, English Composition I, and Environmental Science. This newly amended agreement enables each school to offer the courses most needed by their students (up to 24% of the associate degree) and allows the schools to utilize current instructional staff who hold the appropriate credentials to teach the college-credit course. All staff members serving as Adjunct Instructors on the high school campus will continue to be evaluated with the same process as all other NWFSC instructors.

- College Algebra
- Statistics

Paxton School

- General Biology

South Walton High School

- College Algebra
- English Composition I
- English Composition II
- Principles of Biology Lecture/Lab*

Walton High School

- Statistics

*The amended Agreement will have additional language stating that Walton County School District agrees to provide all lab equipment, supplies, and materials associated with the course BSC1010C Principles of Biology Lecture/Lab to be taught at South Walton High School. The Science Lab Fee will be removed when the class is added to the NWFSC schedule, as material and consumable costs will be paid by the high school.

RECOMMENDATION:
