

# R315, Designation of Service Regions<sup>1</sup>

**R315-1 Purpose:** This policy establishes guidelines for defining geographic service regions for institutions in the Utah System of Higher Education ("USHE"), with the aim is to promote accessibility, quality, and efficiency while allowing for limited exceptions.

#### **R315-3 Definitions**

- **3.1 "Concurrent Enrollment"** is defined by Board Policy R165.
- **3.2 "Institutional Roles"** are defined by Board Policy R312 and include technical college, community college, regional university, and research university.
- **3.3 "Online"** means primarily asynchronous, with regular interactions between students and instructor as part of the teaching and learning process.
- **3.4 "Service Region"** means the Utah county/counties for which an institution is authorized to provide services within its institutional role under Board Policy R312 and within which an institution may establish physical facilities as outlined in Board Policies R401 and R703.

# **R315-4 Service Regions Guidelines**

- **4.1** The Board of Higher Education ("Board") designates service regions for USHE institutions in consultation with the Commissioner's Office and presidents based on the following guidelines:
  - **4.1.1 Accessibility:** Service regions should be designed to promote accessibility to post-secondary educational opportunities throughout the state, with a focus on serving traditionally underserved populations and areas;
  - **4.1.2 Quality:** Service regions should prioritize the delivery of high-quality educational experiences that meet the needs of students, employers, and communities;
  - **4.1.3 Responsiveness:** Service regions should be responsive to local and statewide needs, with a focus on meeting the evolving demands of the economy, society, and education landscape;
  - **4.1.4 Efficiency:** Service regions should be designed to promote the efficient and effective allocation of state resources, with a focus on minimizing duplication of efforts and maximizing collaboration between institutions.

- **4.2** Service regions should be designed to maximize student choice and flexibility, while also promoting the effective delivery of educational programs and services.
- **4.3** Each USHE institution is primarily responsible for providing contracted training or a concurrent enrollment course consistent with its designated institutional role(s) in its service region(s).

#### **R315-5 Designated Service Regions**

- **5.1** In their role as research universities, the University of Utah and Utah State University serve the entire state.
- **5.2** The following table reflects current<sup>2</sup> designated instructional service regions for technical colleges, community colleges, and regional universities:

R315-6 Evaluation of Service Regions: At least every five years, the Board will evaluate service regions to ensure the service regions continue to meet the guidelines in section R315-4 and to address any emerging needs or challenges.

R315-7 Exceptions to Service Regions: Absent an exception under this section or other approval of the Board, an institution may not operate its institutional role(s) outside of its service region(s). When an institution cannot meet its responsibility to provide contracted training or a concurrent enrollment course, it should work to identify another USHE institution that can meet the need.

## 7.1 Requests to Offer Programming outside of Service Region

- **7.1.1 Preference for Adherence to Institutional Role:** The Board may give preference for providing a degree program to an institution with an appropriate institutional role regardless of service regions if the local institution is not authorized for that level of programming.
  - **7.1.1.1** An institution may submit a request to deliver a program or course for programs other than concurrent enrollment outside its service region based on a written proposal between institutions. The request for Board approval shall:
    - **7.1.1.1** Identify the name of the program or course, the institution with primary responsibility and the responsible administrator, the institution providing the program or course, the location in which the program or course will be offered, and the delivery method, e.g., in-person, online, or hybrid;
    - 7.1.1.2 Explain the reason the designated institution cannot provide the requested program or course and the expertise of the institution that is able to provide the program or course; and
    - **7.1.1.3** Describe the impact on each institution, including but not limited to, facility-sharing, budget impacts, and the number of students served.
  - **7.1.1.2** Such agreements shall be limited to five years or less.

### 7.2 Right of First Refusal

- **7.2.1** When an outside entity requests a concurrent enrollment course the institution in the service region has a right of first refusal to offer the program. If the institution in the service region is unable to provide the course, an institution outside the service region may offer the course.
- **7.2.2** Rights of first refusal should be reviewed by the designated institution annually. If the designated institution becomes able to provide the concurrent enrollment course, it shall notify the other institution that it will resume responsibility for the program or course and shall do so as soon as possible.

## 7.3 Cooperative Agreements for Technical Colleges

- **7.3.1** In accordance with Utah Code section 53B-2a-106(5)(a), a technical college may offer technical education or basic instruction outside its service region if:
- **7.3.1.1** The technical education or basic instruction is requested by either an employer or a craft, trade, or apprenticeship program;
- **7.3.1.2** The technical college notifies the Office of the Commissioner and the designated institution about the request; and
- 7.3.1.3 Prior to the contract being finalized or education or training being initiated, the designated institution can make a proposal to the requesting employer or program to offer the requested education or instruction. To be considered, the designated institution shall provide the proposal within one week of the notification given under subsection 7.3.1.2.
- **7.3.2** Subsection 7.3.1.3 does not apply if the requesting employer or program and the technical college to which the requesting employer or program makes its request have a prior training relationship.

- **7.4 Online Instruction:** Fully online programs are an efficient and effective means for USHE institutions to provide broad and more economical access to high-quality instruction. Online programs or courses are exceptions to the service region requirements for degree-granting institutions. Each institution shall annually submit a comprehensive list of these programs and courses to the Commissioner's Office for review.
- **7.5** Exceptions Report: Within one week of an exception being exercised, the institution in the designated service region shall file a report with the Commissioner's Office that includes:
  - **7.5.1** Identifies the name of the program or course, the institution with primary responsibility and the responsible administrator, the institution providing the program or course, the location in which the program or course will be offered, and the delivery method, e.g., in-person, online, or hybrid; and
  - **7.5.2** Explains the reason the designated institution cannot provide the requested program or course and how the other institution will meet the need for the course.
- **7.6 List of Instruction Delivered outside Designated Service Regions:** The Commissioner's Office shall maintain a list of all current programs and courses approved as exceptions under section R315-7. The list shall include the name of the program or course, the institution with primary responsibility and the responsible administrator, the institution providing the program or course, the location in which the program or course will be offered, and the delivery method, e.g., in-person, online, or hybrid.
