




Enrollment Trends

Capital investment in higher education Percent of total state capital investment



Shrinking state capital investment Minnesota State – Down 30+% in total funding



Conclusions

- » Minnesota State colleges and universities are overbuilt for current and foreseeable needs.
- » There are insufficient resources (capital and operating) to (properly) maintain and sustain Minnesota State's college and university campus facilities.
- » A new approach and strategy towards planning, assessing, and prioritizing facilities is needed.



Recommendations – Short Term

- » Third-party Facility Condition Assessment protocol
- » Building Component Recommissioning and Retrocommissioning
- » 2026 Capital Program Guidance



Recommendations – Long Term

- » Update Comprehensive Facilities Planning (CFP) Guidance
- » Repurpose and Remove Strategy
- » Maximize impact of available funding
- » Explore Alternative Funding Streams
